Our Path Topic

Over the last year and a half, the District has focused on early childhood education. As those who work in schools, we understand the importance of early childhood development. However, WASD is working to help inform and improve early childhood development throughout the communities of the district.

The WASD School Board approved the Child Development Center that will be housed in the D Wing of the high school. It will include two Pre-K Counts classes (funded by grants) and an employer-sponsored daycare for 3-4 year olds. The wing will include an indoor large motor skill area, a parent training room and an outside play area. It will also have the Child Development Class in the secured wing. Much work is yet to be done.

By the end of May, the goal is to have a staged, model classroom for our employees to see and visit during an open house for the center and possibly at another time for just employees. The plan is to open the center as a PA Keystone Star Program Star 4. That means that it have the highest rating of childcare quality as recognized by the State of PA.

We know we need at least 15 children for the program to run feasibly. Over the next month or two, the plan is to promote the center, the program offerings, and the price. It is an opportunity for our employees to have high quality childcare. Early childhood development is an initiative part of our strategic objective to improve the District culture and climate and the objective of becoming a First Choice organization for our employees.

There is much more information to come, but this seemed to be a good time to share the good news.
