Our Path Topic

Since WASD has adopted a strong approach to early childhood education by developing over seven Pre-K classes, this year the parenting aspect is now being pursued. This pursuit is through the P3 Initiative.

Erica Nemzek, WASD's Early Childhood Coordinator, is leading the P3 Initiative (Pre-Natal to Third Grade) this year. She is developing a large group of early childhood professionals, county agency coordinators, board members and so many others.

This year, with a grant award of \$10,000, WASD is pursuing this parent initiative. A WASD team attended the Governor's Institute for Early Childhood this summer. Through that institute, WASD was eligible for the money. The team had to develop a specific objective to address parenting and preparing children for school.

Out of that grant, an initiative titled "Be the Village" has arisen. Below you will find the logo. When you see the logo, you will know that it is Be the Village.

Be the Village is a project that will put parenting tips, reading materials, and other activities and information in the hands of parents to use with their child. The plan is to place these Be the Village signs and boxes throughout the school district in our different communities. This is only the start. We hope it will continue to grow and be more and more effective with helping parents help their children be more successful in life and school.

Be the Village and the P3 Initiative Team will be at the October 5th Market Day 9AM to 4PM downtown Waynesboro. The group will be in front of the Alexander Hamilton Free Public Library. The group and the library have been working in partnership to promote literacy and parenting skills. As we know, kids learn to read up to third grade, and read to learn after third grade. It is critical to help students be more prepared and ready for school in order to meet that literacy objective.
