## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE SCHOOL MEALS

### Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn.Pocola School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$2.10 Lunch costs \$2.45 ELEM.(MS/HS \$ 2.75). Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced-price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. This packet includes an application for free or reduced-price meal benefits and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

- 1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED-PRICE MEALS?
- All children in households receiving benefits from (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program [SNAP]), (Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations [FDPIR], or (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families [TANF]) are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children who are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced-price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the federal Income-Eligibility Guidelines (IEGs). Your children may qualify for free or reduced-price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and have not been told your children will get free meals, please call or email Janie Vincent at 918-436-2042 or jvincent@pocolaschools.org (homeless liaison, or migrant coordinator).
- 3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Free and Reduced-Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Pocola Schools P.O BOX 640 Pocola, Ok 74902.
- 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact Pocola Schools 918-436-2424 immediately.

- 5. CAN I APPLY ONLINE? NO! You are encouraged to complete a WRITTEN/PAPER application instead. (MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes.
  - Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year, through (SEPTEMBER 22, 2023). You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year. If you do not send in a new application that is approved by the school or you have not been notified that your child is eligible for free meals, your child will be charged the full price for meals.
- 6. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC MAY be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Please send in an application.
- 7. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
- 8. IF I DO NOT QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 9. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Jason Brittain or email <a href="mailto:jbrittain@pocolaschools.org">jbrittain@pocolaschools.org</a>).
- 10. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A UNITED STATES (U.S.) CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced-price meals.
- 11. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you NORMALLY receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 12. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will ALSO be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you MEANT to do so.
- 13. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off -base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.
- 14. WHAT IF THERE IS NOT ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper, and attach it to your application. Contact (91-436-2424) to receive a second application.
- 15. MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for (SNAP) or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or call 1-877-760-0114 or scan the QR code:

### HOW TO APPLY FOR FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE SCHOOL MEALS

Please use these instructions to help you fill out the application for free or reduced-price school meals. You only need to submit ONE application per household, even if your children attend more than one school in <u>Pocola School District</u>. The application must be filled out completely to certify your children for free or reduced-price school meals.

Please follow these instructions in order! Each step of the instructions is the same as the steps on your application. If at any time you are not sure what to do next, please contact Pocola Schools 918-436-2424.

PLEASE USE A PEN (NOT A PENCIL) WHEN FILLING OUT THE APPLICATION, AND DO YOUR BEST TO PRINT CLEARLY.

STEP 1: LIST ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS WHO ARE INFANTS, CHILDREN, AND STUDENTS UP TO AND INCLUDING GRADE 12

Tell us how many infants, children, and school students live in your household. They do NOT have to be related to you to be a part of your household.

Who should I list here?

When filling out this section, please include ALL members in your household who are:

- Children aged 18 or under AND are supported with the household's income.
- In your care under a foster arrangement or qualify as homeless, migrant, or runaway youth.
- Students attending Pocola Schools, regardless of age.
- A. List each child's name. For each child, print his/her first name, middle initial, and last name. Use one line of the application for each child. If there are more children present than lines on the application, attach a second piece of paper with all required information for the additional children.
- B. Is the child a student at Pocola Public Schools? Mark Yes or No under the column titled Student to tell us which children attend Pocola School District..
- C. Do you have any foster children? If any children listed are foster children, mark the Foster Child box next to the child's name. If you are ONLY applying for foster children, after completing STEP 1, skip to STEP 4 of the application and these instructions. If you are applying for both foster and non foster children, go to STEP 3. Foster children who live with you may count as members of your household and should be listed on your application.
- D. Are any children homeless, migrant, or runaway? If you believe any child listed in this section may meet this description, please mark the Homeless, Migrant, Runaway box next to the child's name and complete all steps of the application.

STEP 2: DO ANY HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS (INCLUDING YOU) CURRENTLY PARTICIPATE IN ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS: SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SNAP), TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF), OR FOOD DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM ON INDIAN RESERVATIONS (FDPIR)? If Yes, record the proper case number (only one per household)

in the box. Skip to STEP 4.

If anyone in your household participates in the assistance programs, your children are ELIGIBLE for free school meals.

If <u>NO ONE</u> in your household participates in any of the above programs:

Leave STEP 2 blank and go to STEP 3

If ANYONE in your household participates in any of the above programs:

- Write a case number for SNAP, TANF, OR FDPIR. You only need to provide one case number. If you participate in one of these programs and do not know your case number, contact your caseworker..

### STEP 3: REPORT INCOME FOR ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS

### How do I report my income?

- Report all amounts in GROSS INCOME ONLY. Report all income in whole dollars. Do not include cents.
   Gross income is the total income received before taxes.
  - Many people think of income as the amount they take home and not the total gross amount. Make sure that the income you report on this application has NOT been reduced to pay for taxes, insurance premiums, or any other amounts taken from your pay.
- Write a 0 in any field where there is no income to report. Any income fields left empty or blank will also be counted as a zero. If you write 0 or leave any fields blank, you are certifying (promising) that there is no income to report. If local officials suspect that your household income was reported incorrectly, your application will be investigated.
- · Mark how often each type of income is received using the check boxes to the right of each field.
- A. Report all income earned or received by children. Report the combined gross income for ALL children listed in STEP 1 in your household in the box marked "Child Income." Only count foster children's income if you are applying for them together with the rest of your household.

### What is Child Income?

Child income is money received from outside your household that is paid DIRECTLY to your children. Many households do not have any child income.

How do I fill in the income amount and source?

- · Mark how often each type of income is received using the check boxes to the right of each field.
- B. List adult household members' names. Print the name of each household member in the boxes marked Names of Adult Household Members (First and Last). Do not list any household members you listed in STEP 1. If a child listed in STEP 1 has income, follow the instructions in STEP 3, Part A.
- C. Report earnings from work. Refer to the chart titled Sources of Income for Adults in these instructions, and report all income from work in the Earnings From Work field on the application. This is usually the money received from working at jobs. If you are a self-employed business or farm owner, you will report your net income. This is calculated by subtracting the total operating expenses of your business from its gross receipts or revenues.
- D. Report income from public assistance/child support/alimony. Refer to the chart titled Sources of Income for Adults in these instructions, and report all income that applies in the Public Assistance/Child Support/Alimony field on the application. Do not report the value of any cash value public assistance benefits NOT listed on the chart. If income is received from child support or alimony, only court-ordered payments should be reported here. Informal regular payments should be reported as Other income in the next part.
- E. Report income from pensions/retirement/all other income. Refer to the chart titled Sources of Income for Adults in these instructions, and report all income that applies in the Pensions/Retirement/All Other Income field on the application.
- F. Report total household size. Enter the total number of household members in the field Total Household Members (Children and Adults). This number MUST be equal to the number of household members listed in STEP 1 and STEP 3. If there are any members of your household that you have not listed on the application, go back and add them. It is very important to list all household members, as the size of your household affects your eligibility for free or reduced price meals.
- G. Provide the last four digits of your social security number. The household's primary wage earner or another adult household member must enter the last four digits of his/her social security number in the space provided. You are eligible to apply for benefits even if you do not have a social security number. If no adult household member has a social security number, leave this space blank and mark the box to the right labeled Check if no SSN.

- A. Provide your contact information. Write your current address in the fields provided if this information is available. If you have no permanent address, this does not make your children ineligible for free or reduced-price school meals. Sharing a phone number, e-mail address, or both is optional, but helps us reach you quickly if we need to contact you.
- B. Print and sign your name. Print your name in the box Printed Name of Adult Completing the Form. Sign your name in the box Signature of Adult Completing the Form.
- C. Today's date. In the space provided, write today's date.
- D. Share children's racial and ethnic identities (optional). On the back of the application, we ask you to share information about your children's race and ethnicity. This field is optional and does not affect your children's eligibility for free or reduced-price school meals.
