Citizenship in School

In Burr Oak Community Schools, we make citizenship a priority. It is our hope and our belief that our expectations here will extend into the broader community when students leave us.

Responsible citizenship means there is a sense of group responsibility to one another; peer problem solving helps students assist each other in being accountable for actions and choices.

This philosophy is part of our restorative practice system. Every day is a new day for students and we teach them they can be the person they want to be and that they can choose better every time they make a mistake. While there might be plenty of excuses for negative behaviors that students might or might not be personally aware of, it is our job to help them unlearn negative behaviors and grow their emotional intelligence into positive ones. We do this through collaboration, critical thinking, and by giving students the skills needed to voice their opinions respectfully to one another.

Our basic expectations in regard to being a good citizen in the school community are:

- 1. Be kind (to yourself and to others)
- 2. Be respectful (of others and the property of others)
- 3. Follow rules (school, classroom, and coaches' rules)
- 4. Display positive character traits (honesty, trustworthy, dependability)
- 5. Give back (community service, active participation in school and community events)

Second grade has been working on one of the hardest units of the year, Place Value. The class did well overall and has a much better understanding of how numbers are compiled of digits and units. In science they have wrapped up the unit about landforms and are now learning about how the earth slowly changes over time.

Third grade has been continuing the place value unit. Rounding numbers and input/output boxes were the hardest for the class but after some practice they passed with flying colors. They are now going to move on to Multiplication!!! In science they have been learning more about weather. The water cycle and different types of clouds was their favorite lessons of the unit so far. We will now be exploring how wind is made.

Second and Third Graders are off to a good start acclimating to our new curriculum. We are about to add a second piece that will differentiate each of your students' needs. That is the part I, as a teacher, am most excited about. Each of these classes have recently collaborated to write and illustrate a story book. As I write this, we are wrapping up some final touches. Your student will bring home a copy soon. Our kids have some fantastic, creative ideas when prompted.

In our themed art specials we are completing a 9 week unit about symbols of the State of Michigan. All the students, grades 1-4, have made some super cute projects. My greatest goal is for the students to understand that art is a unique personal expression, and there is no "right answer" in this class. Try quizzing your students about state symbols. Like me, I think you might be surprised by their knowledge. Our next quarter will focus on fall holidays such as Thanksgiving, Diwali, Hanukkah, Christmas etc. I am so happy for the opportunity in our school day to celebrate special things with our kiddos. <3

In language arts, we will learn about context clues and how this strategy can help us comprehend what we are reading. We will be studying analogies and Greek roots words to improve our vocabulary and spelling. Our upcoming unit will be focusing on narrative writing with sensory details.

In math, we will be working on triple-digit and four-digit multiplication, and story problems. PLEASE practice your multiplication facts with your student! We will be using them throughout the year. I do not want to have any of our students struggling throughout the year. If you need any flashcards, please let me know. I have plenty of flashcards!

Classroom News

Mr. Bucklin Physical Education

The Bobcats have been busy in Physical Education, in which the elementary students have received their necklaces for "Walking Wednesdays". Every Wednesday that the weather allows we will be going out and walking/running the track. Each time a student completes one lap they receive a "foot" pendant to add to the necklace.

For the middle school classes, students have been introduced to the weight room for basic weight training. They have been working hard and completing daily workouts very well. They have enjoyed finding strength that they often didn't know they had.

The High School class is doing well also, it is primarily a weight training class. We spend 3-4 days a week in the weight room, with daily routines that each student completes. They might not realize it but they are gaining strength, a couple students are doing extra and are going through a "Jump Program" to increase their vertical leap and explosiveness. I have one student who came to me at the beginning of the year and wanted to lose some weight, that student is now down 20lbs. Be proud of your Bobcats, they are working hard.

The 9th grade U.S. History class is discussing United States Imperialism and next we will be learning about the United States' involvement in the first World War.

In 6th grade, students are learning about the different government types that are found throughout the world. Next, Students will begin studying the geography of South America

The 7th grade social studies class is finishing up the unit on the geography of Africa. Next, students will begin studying the geography of Asia.

The Econ class is studying the different government regulatory agencies and their purpose. Next, the econ students will be learning about current issues with the United States economy.

The 10th grade World History class is learning about Latin American Civilizations. Next, they will be studying the Columbian Exchange.

Mr. Ultz History of Foods

This nine weeks, the eighth grade will be in the class. This year the eight graders will be helping to get ready for the Thanksgiving

On feast day, they will be serving all students, teachers, parents, grandparents, and community members. Hope to see you all there for the 24th annual Thanksgiving Day Feast.

Social Studies- The class has been studying different civilizations and how they developed. They also learned how geography played a big part in that development. The class will now start the study of empires. Civilizations and empires have many similarities but also many differences. They will then be looking at early empires. Middle School Arts and Crafts: By the time this Oak Opening goes out, my first arts class will have left and I will have half of the 6th grade. 7A and 7B Math: We are finishing up on our expressions unit and I have seen some of the students start taking more pride in their accomplishments. Though we may take a little longer on the topics, I have assured them that they are learning 7th grade content and I do not feel like they are behind due to Covid. Next, we will be working with equations and inequalities.

8th Grade Math: Students finished an in depth study into scientific notation. After we reviewed solving basic equations, students are now learning to solve those with variables on both sides. It is taking a bit longer to get them focused than it did last year, but they are still doing a great job.

I use a variety of internet resources such as ixl, Prodigy, New Jersey Curriculum, ThatQuiz, Quizizz, Math Antics and EDpuzzle to name a few. When these are assigned, their completion will only be recorded on that website and not in the Google Classroom. If a student marks that it is that completed, one needs to see it in the website to know for sure.

High School Heath: We continue to learn about and discuss both physical and emotional health. Today's teens deal with many issues that put them in awkward and often dangerous situations. They are much more worldly than I was in my day. Hopefully as we continue, they will be more prepared to deal with the pressures of being a teenager.

Please encourage your students to do their best while at school. Your encouragement and academic expectations are the most powerful influences they have.

The teams will have been organized and we are in the building stages of the robot. High school mentor Karl Alghrim has been giving help to the build teams as well as Mr. Herrmann and Mr. Sutton. 


