MCMS Highlight: Restorative Practices

In an effort to share with you as much as we can about our school, I will work hard this year to include different educational highlights about us throughout this year. These will be brief descriptions about our curriculum and educational programming to better inform you about what MCMS is made up of!

Maranacook Community Middle School is proud to use Restorative Practices throughout our school. Restorative Practices proactively builds positive school communities while also reducing discipline referrals, suspensions and expulsions. The underlying premise of Restorative Practices is the belief that people will make positive changes when those in positions of authority do things with them rather than to them or for them. As a school, we feel strongly that the shift to these practices have very positive impact on our school community. Restorative Practices create opportunities for students to become aware of the impact of their behavior and to help them take responsibility for their actions.

Studies show that Restorative Practices strengthen relationships between individuals as well as social connections within the school community. The middle school has committed to implement practices in our classrooms and advisee groups in order to help our students foster a positive sense of community and responsibility for their own actions. This year, all advisors will be using community circles at least once a week, in their advisee groups. To the students, the circles are a time for them to share amongst their peers, and support students in finding more connections with school and our community. Through the circles, students are working towards creating a common culture that values collaboration, risk-taking, respect, openness and honesty.
