ELC - Two Programs, One Location

At the Marysville Early Learning Center, we provide both ECEAP Preschool and Developmental Preschool programs. Here's a brief description of what we are doing in each program:

<u>Developmental Preschool:</u> Our Developmental Preschool teachers are working on specially designed instructional strategies for our preschool aged children. Depending on each child's needs, areas of focus may include working on skills such as communication, speech and language, adaptive skills (for example, bathroom routines), or large or fine motor skills such as buttoning or zipping a jacket, picking up small toys, jumping and galloping. Our special education teachers also work on behavioral, social/emotional skills and providing sensory supports for students.

<u>ECEAP Preschool:</u> The Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a pre-kindergarten program is working on kindergarten readiness skills such as number sense, letter writing and letter sound recognition. These are all skills students need to be successful on the WaKIDS whole child assessment that students take the first few weeks of kindergarten.

ELC Parent Committee

The ELC is having a Parent Advisory Committee called, "ELC Cafe". These meetings will be held once a month on Friday mornings from 9:30-10:30 and childcare will be provided. We will be planning and discussing family events on campus as well as new ideas and interests of the parent group.
