Prior to the event, please complete the following:

- Go to FAFSA.gov to create your Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID). (You'll need an email address to use this.)
 - The FSA ID is a secure, unique ID that you'll use to log in to the site so you can fill out the FAFSA. It is also used to electronically sign your application at the very end of the process. Don't share your FSA ID with anyone, and don't let anyone else create one for you. If you are a dependent student, your parents will also need to create their own FSA ID.

Please bring with you the following to the event to complete your FAFSA:

- Your students fully charged Chromebook
- Your driver's license/ID and Social Security number
- Your parents' Social Security numbers and birthdates
- Your family's latest federal income tax returns
- W-2 forms
- Bank statements from checking and savings
- Investment information for things like mutual funds and other assets
