Some common examples are:

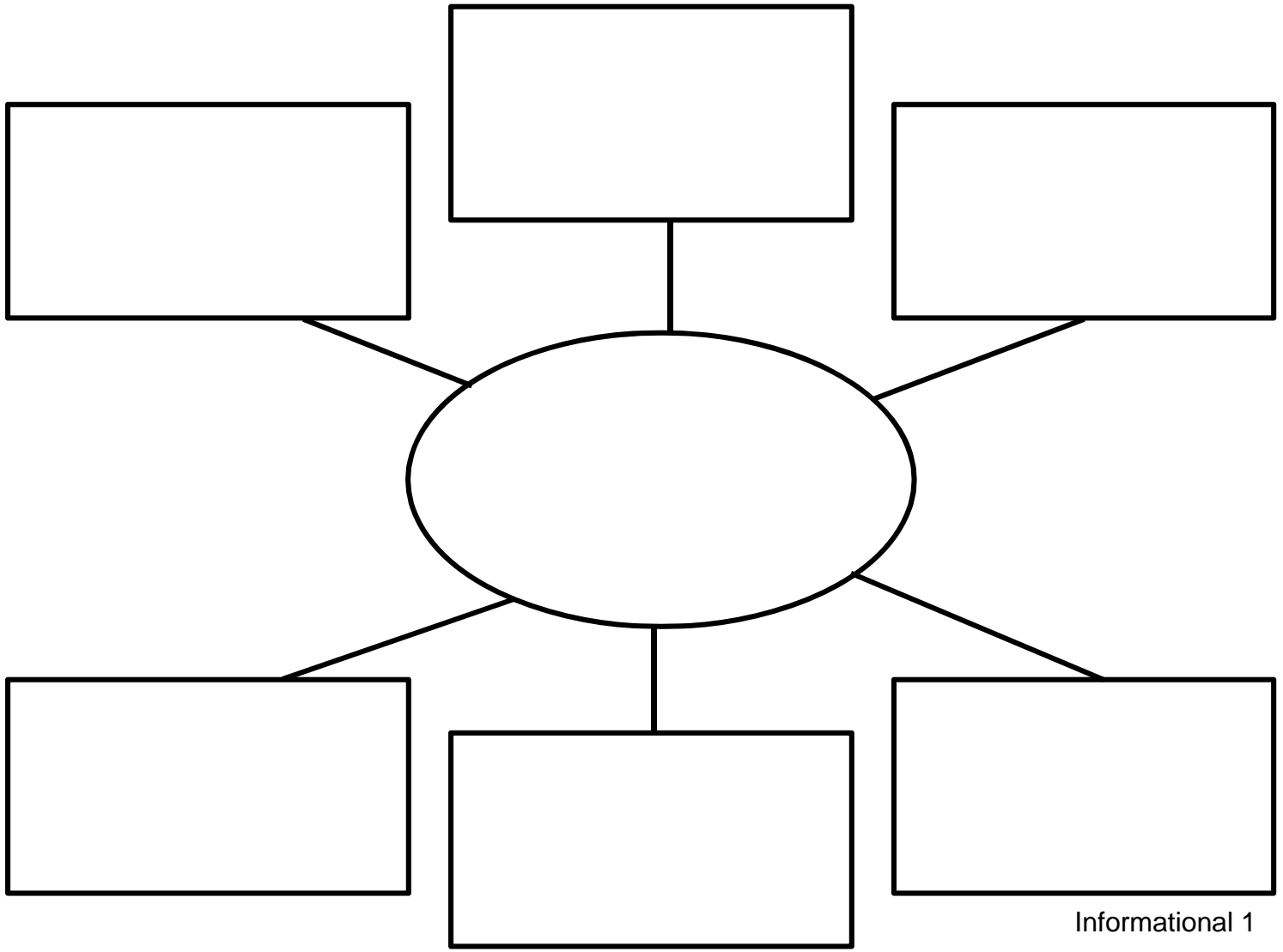
- *Books about a particular subject*

### Prior Knowledge Map

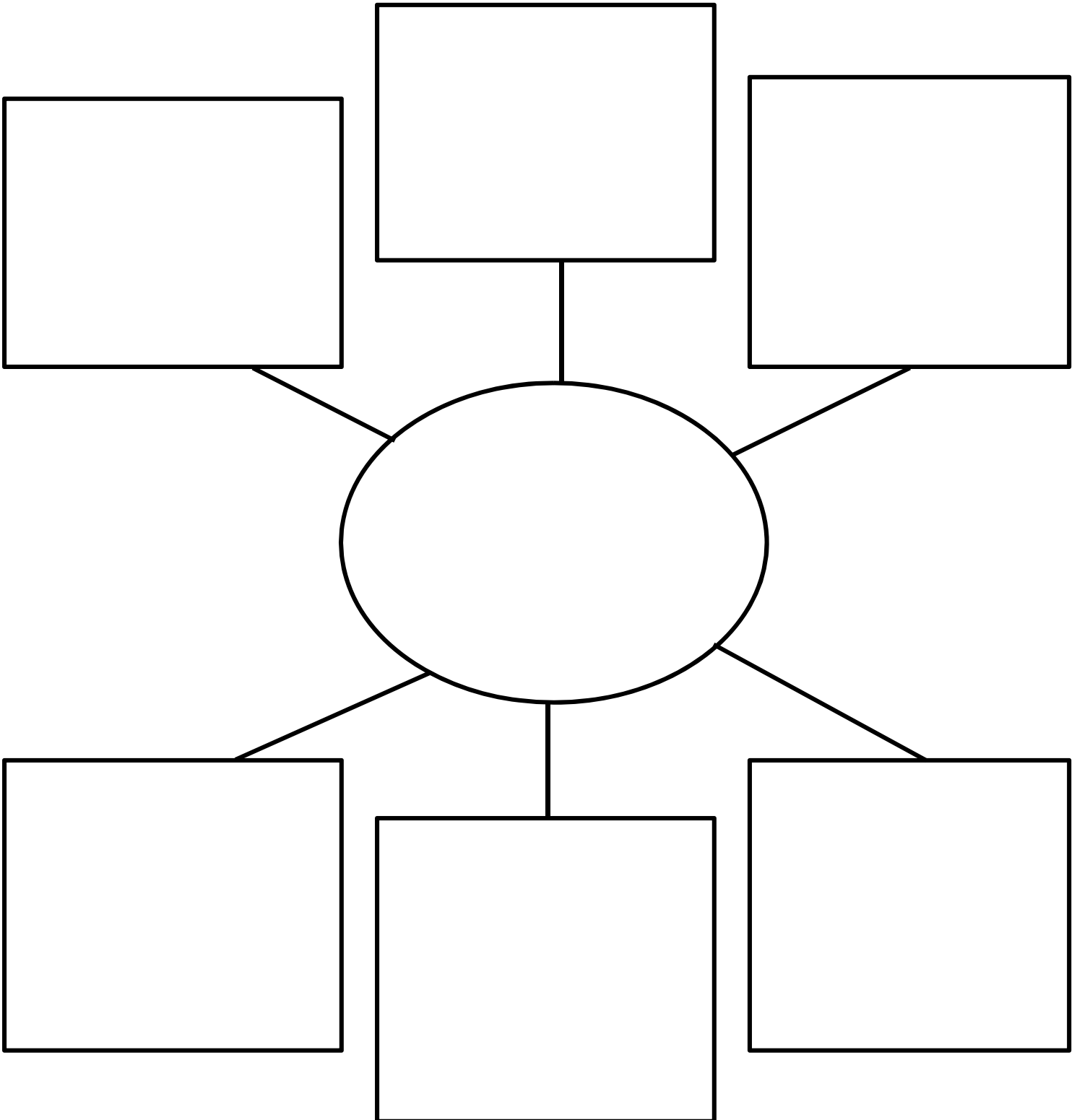

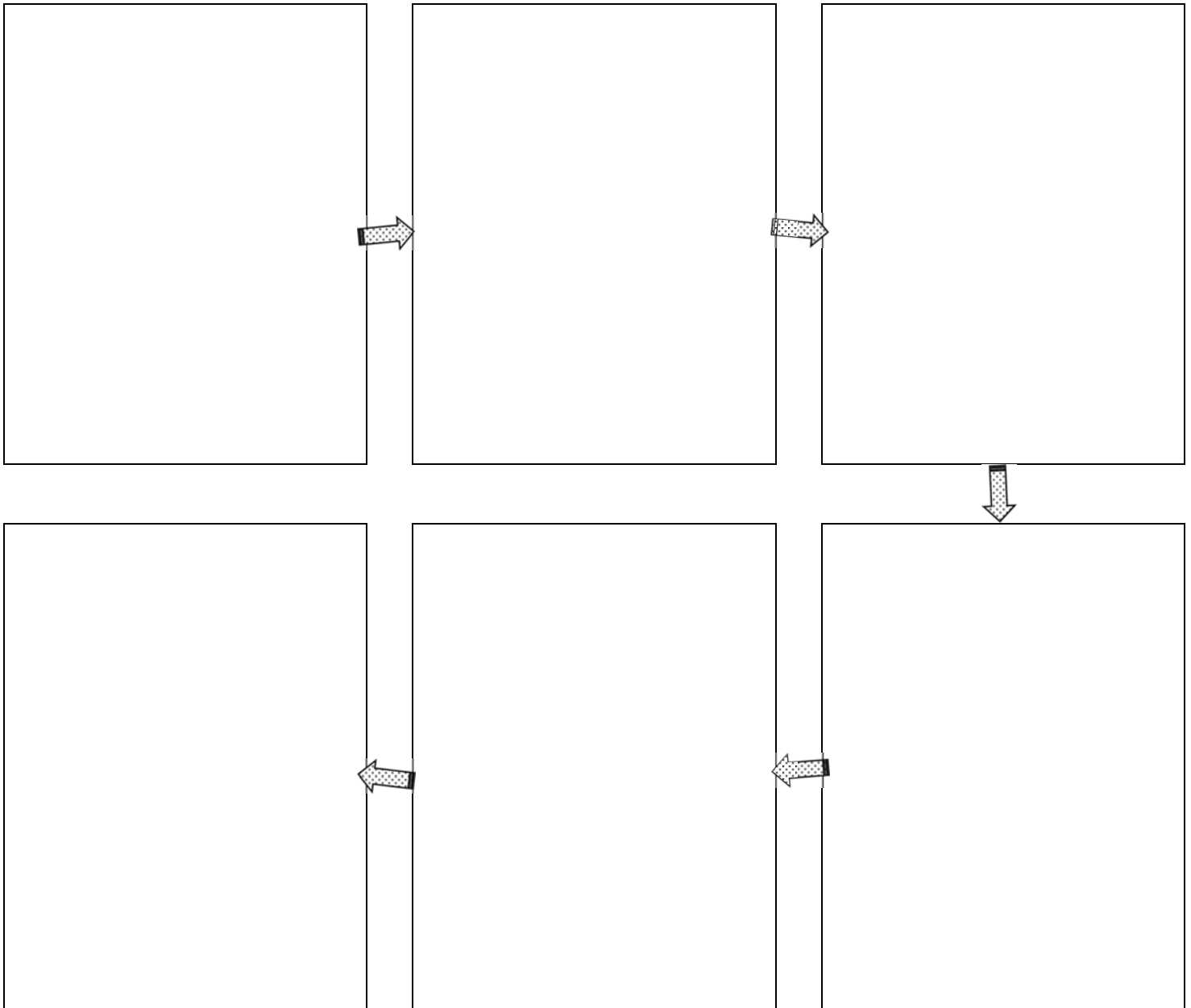
## Main Idea and Details
