Under the leadership of Dianne Eberhardt, Dr. Diane McCallum, Emily Goodine, Megan McGuire, Matt Jenkins and staffs, below are some of the focus for supporting our First Choice vision.

The elementary schools are working on *First Choice* through several means. Below are a few. Academic Pillar:

- Differentiated instruction within the classroom (guided reading groups, guided math groups)
- Pilot programs in grade 4
- Cross classroom grouping for guided reading
- Reading support from a reading specialist.
- Keyboarding grades 3 to 5.

### The Career Pillar:

- Smart Futures CCR activities.
- Project TEAM career-focused lessons.
- Fifth-grade students visit the Franklin County Career & Technical Center

### Whole Child Pillar:

- Project TEAM lessons each month.
- Social skills groups facilitated by Healthy Communities Partnership, school counselor, and/or social worker.
- Elementary Student Assistance Program (ESAP) established in all buildings.
- Social workers
- Check and Connect attendance program.
- Pre-K Counts Classes added additional classes in 2019/20—over 100 students served.
- Trauma Classroom (Inspire)
- Growth Mindset focus

- Professional Development Book Studies
- Self-paced and self-selected professional learning
- Visitations to model districts participating in IU8 grant
- Surveys—Professional Development and New Teachers
- DSW Differentiated Supervision
- Instructional Rounds Math 3-12
- PLDC (PA Leadership Development Corporation) training and coaching for WASD administration.
- Employer-sponsored child care-January
- WellSpan Walk-In Clinic for Staff and families.
