A *School-Parent Compact for Academic Achievement* is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all of our students reach grade-level standards.

Effective compacts:

- ⇒ Link to goals of the School Improvement Plan
- ⇒ Focus on student learning skills
- ⇒ Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- ⇒ Share strategies parents can use at home
- ⇒ Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- ⇒ Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom.

Teacher/School Responsibilities

- Provide students with appropriate books to increase Lexile/AR levels, vocabulary, and comprehension
- Provide weekly homework, vocabulary lists, skill sheets, apps and websites for families to practice at home
- Provide multiple opportunities for families to discuss their child's grades via conferences, phone calls, Remind/Class Dojo, texts, e-mails, and agendas
- Provide workshops in order to share classroom strategies with families
- Utilize software programs and technology to increase student achievement

Family Responsibilities

- Encourage my child to read appropriate books to increase Lexile/AR levels, vocabulary, and comprehension
- Check weekly homework and skill sheets to ensure my child completes homework and studies for assessments
- Contact my child's teacher to discuss their academics through conferences, phone calls, Remind/Class Dojo, and/or emails
- Participate in workshops to gain knowledge and skills in order to help my child achieve academic success
- Help my child become more fluent in reading and math using materials, apps, and websites provided by the teacher or Parent Resource Center

Student Responsibilities

- Read appropriate books to increase my Lexile/AR levels, vocabulary and comprehension
- Check my homework and skill sheets to complete my homework and study for weekly tests
- Talk to my parents about my school day and what I am learning
- Bring home newsletters and notices about parent workshops and other school meetings
- Practice reading and math skills using the apps/websites/practice sheets my teacher has provided or my parents checked out from the Parent Resource Center
