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<u>Principal's Message</u> WHES Begins Monthly "Hot Breakfast Program"

Beginning on October 31st the WHES School Nutrition Program will hold the first "WHES Hot Breakfast Program." Available to all students and staff, this special breakfast will offer a seasonally-oriented menu and classes will eat in the gym, picnic style. It is a chance for the entire school community to gather together and enjoy a unique hot breakfast offering. Daily breakfast offerings at WHES are a typically bagged "grab and go" fare that are taken back to the classrooms. This new monthly offering will consist of a hot breakfast entree with fruit and milk. On Halloween morning the menu will feature pumpkin-chocolate chip pancakes with maple syrup, a fruit choice and milk. Students who qualify for free or reduced lunch will be covered for the cost of this special breakfast, for students not enrolled in that program the cost for participating in this breakfast is \$1.40. Students can bring in that money ahead of time and it will be deposited in their account or monies can be brought in on the day of the monthly hot breakfast program. Vicki Dill, WHES Kitchen Manager, is excited about offering this new program to all WHES students and hopes that everyone will participate. Grades 3-5

Capen: In reading we continue to work on our character study units. 6th grade is focusing on setting and time, and how that can influence a character.
