

Aleah Sutterby Memorial Math Scholarship

Who Is Eligible To Apply

Any Uniontown High School Graduating senior who has had a minimum of four years of Mathematics Education (with at least two years of mathematics education at Uniontown), is eligible to apply

Note: Preference may be given to students who intend to pursue a career in a mathematics or science-related field.

What Will Be Considered

Financial need of the student

Long-term educational plans, such as type of educational institution to be attended and for how long

High School Achievements: Academic record, activities, and honors

Expected contributions to a mathematics or science-related profession

Amount and Term of Scholarship

A two semester scholarship of \$250 per semester is available. The scholarship is renewable for the second semester with official notification of a minimum of a 3.0 G.P.A. from the first semester, for a total value of \$500 to the recipient.

Additional funding is possible for students entering a veterinarian, or science program. Documentation of admission and transcripts required at that time.

When Will The Recipient Be Announced

The scholarship winner will be announced at the school awards banquet and will receive the money upon official notification of enrollment and payment of fees.

Note: A copy of your high school transcript will be needed along with this application.
