Selection will be based primarily on academic achievement. Where academic achievement alone produces no clear winner or the winner based on academic achievement has little or no financial need for the scholarship award, the Trustee will consider demonstrated concern for others, academic promise, financial need, and informal educational accomplishments in making the selection.

Upon selection, the Trustee will notify the recipient and the recipient's qualified educational institution of the award. A qualified educational institution is one that normally maintains a regular faculty and curriculum and normally has a regularly enrolled body of pupils or students in attendance at the place where its educational activities are regularly carried on. The Trustee will arrange to apply the scholarship grant to the recipient's tuition account with the recipient's qualified educational institution in as many installments as possible without additional charge and will inform the educational institution of the criteria the recipient must meet for installments of the grant to continue to be paid.

To retain the scholarship grant for up to four years and prevent it from becoming null and void the recipient must: be graduated from high school; choose and attend a qualified educational institution, that is, one that normally maintains a regular faculty and curriculum and normally has a regularly enrolled body of pupils or students in attendance at the place where its educational activities are regularly carried on; be enrolled as a degree candidate at the educational institution; enter and remain in a program leading to a degree; attend the educational institution for consecutive years without withdrawing or being expelled; maintain a grade point average of 2.5 on a scale where 4.0 is the highest grade point average, or equivalent academic achievement under the grading system of the institution attended; and not intentionally engage in any conduct that violates the Golden Rule or is harmful to the Trust.
