
## **REMINDERS**


- \* As stated in the Elementary Handbook, students will generally be sent home if, they throw up and feel ill, have a fever of 100, have suspected head lice, or some other possible communicable illness.
- \* If a student injury occurs while at school, we will do our best to determine the level of severity based on what the accident was, if there is an obvious deep cut, or visible broken bone, as well as the student's demeanor 15-20 minutes after the injury. If the injury seems severe we will attempt to contact parents to inform them and if necessary contact emergency services. If a student calms down after 20 minutes and goes on with their day we may consider them to be okay, but will still try and make contact in case the injury turns out to need treatment.

## Other Information

- \*ALL LOST AND FOUND items from the beginning of the year were donated after conferences. There has been a very large number of items left around the building. We will keep items until there is no room left to store them and will then donate those items throughout the year. If you notice something missing from your child's wardrobe come check at the office immediately.
- \*Fall youth sports ended and winter youth sports are underway. We had over 120 students take part in a fall sport and currently for basketball and wrestling we have about the same amount of students participating. That is amazing! We recently received data from the Nebraska Department of Education regarding our school's performance on state testing from the 2018-2019 school year. Schools receive a ranking of Excellent, Great, Good, or Needs Improvement. On average 10 percent of schools attain a score of Excellent, 40 percent attain a score of Great, 40 percent earn a Good score and 10 percent get classified as Needs in Improvement. Our elementary earned the status of GREAT! We are proud of our students, teachers, paras, parents and ALL who are involved in making our school days operate smoothly. Included below are graphs showing Cedar Bluffs Elementary scores in math and reading in comparison to the state averages and also in comparison to all other elementary schools in the local area. We did very well in comparison local schools and are in the top 2 in each category.
