Do You Remember...?- "Itasca's Cafe"

Itasca has been blessed over the years with some really good eating places: cafes or restaurants. One person said the only differences between a cafe and restaurant is about five or ten dollars.

Itasca started having eating places during the early days of the town. Some of the older ones were Frank Thompsons Itasca Cafe almost a hundred years ago, the American Candy Kitchen, Bon Ton Confectionery, Greens Confectionery, the Hodges Brothers Cafe in 1906 and C.C. Livingston Short Order around 1900. Then there was "Morrissey's" operated by Mrs. Morris with the help of her daughter, Maydell (Morris) Pruitt. It was located on the school grounds in the

1930's. She had delicious hamburgers for a dime and two chocolate covered donuts for five cents. Many of the school kids ate lunch there. Another popular eating place was the Rainbow Inn next to the Petrified Station. It was owned by Homer and Mae Dodson. Besides their other good food, Mae was famous for her ham and cheese sandwich. Joe Bradley had a cafe on East Main Street where the Farrow Room is now. It was a popular hangout for the young people. Joe Jr. and Doris helped sometimes and their friends headquartered there.

It was not a cafe, but a confectionery owned by Walter Pruitt, affectionately known as "Uncle Hez." it was a popular place for all ages. He made his ice cream and his specialty was Banana Nut and Strawberry. I remember eating those five cent Strawberry Cones myself in the 1930's. Kids loved Uncle Hez, and he was fond of them.

Then there was the Cozy Cafe owned by D.O. Knick for years. The Rotary Club ate there each Thursday when it was first formed in 1937. The Cozy Cafe existed until Mr. Knick sold it to Pat and Ruth Patterson. They called it the "Roundup Cafe." When Pat and Ruth left Itasca to open a Roundup in Gatesville, they sold the building to Wendell and Ann Jordan for their "Ideal Cleaners." When Wendell and Ann moved their business to Hillsboro the building is now owned by Carl and Gaynelle Seale.

Another popular eating place was Gladys Sweeney's Cafe. She was famous for her steaks and home-made pies. Before Gladys moved into the building there was Villa Hodge who also had excellent food. I remember I sold her pigeons for her cafe. She had a few customers who thought the squabs were delicious. Woodrow and Ernestine Coutret operated their cafe, called the "Cactus Cafe" where Cindy Lou's is now.

Also there was always a snack bar at Cotton Mill. There were several owners over the years, such as Jake Lackey, W.L. and Olive Mae Chandler, George and Ruby Valentine and Ruby's father before that. At one time Mrs. Wright also made sandwiches at home and sold them to the mill workers. Elma Clamp told me that some of his relatives were involved in the vending units that sold hamburgers and other items to the mill workers. The original store was operated by Katie Johnson, and it was called "Charlie's Shack."

There were many eating places in and around Itasca; I do not have a listing of them all. Some of the ones I remember were, Barney's Canteen owned by Franklin Martin, Holland's Cafe, the Green Lantern Sandwich Shop in 1930, Dominguez Bar and Grill, Adwells Cafe, Carl and Marguriet's Snack Bar in the Tower Theater and Estalene Turners "Cats Den" across from the school.

I guess one of the most popular cafes in itasca history was "Franks Cafe," owned by Frank and Gracie Lee Etter. It was a place of good food and a popular hangout by young and old. Gracie didn't have much time for the cafe; she was too busy raising five girls, Mary Alyce, Hazel Dean, Luthene, Frances Lee, and Enid.

Frank added a room in the back with a Juke Box for the young people; however it was also enjoyed by some of the older citizens, such as B.B. Christian, Toad Moore, Jay and Gracie Faries, Buster Ince, Ralph Bailey, and other who danced.

Frank had a chili recipe that was excellent. He would not reveal it to anyone, except once. He told Luthene who entered a chili contest at one of the Itasca Arts and Crafts fairs. She won the grand prize. She had been encouraged to enter by her daughter-in-law Diana Taylor.

Bud and Verna Laird purchased the café owned by Frank Etter. Their place turned out to be a popular and successful business. They had good old fashion food that was popular with everyone. Dr. Campbell liked to go there for his coffee and enjoyed teasing and having friendly arguments with Ada Kirkpatrick.
