Inventions are evaluated based on their impact in the workplace.

## Knots of Love

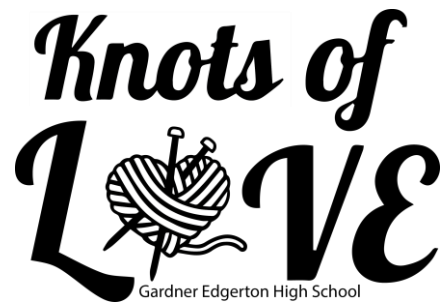

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## National Honor Society (NHS)

NHS is dedicated to promoting scholarship, service, character and leadership in high school students. Our local chapter hosts the fall blood drive, and our members serve as volunteers throughout the community for a variety of schools and organizations.

**Eligibility and How to Join:** Juniors who have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher are eligible to apply each fall. Successful applicants must demonstrate a history of outstanding scholarship, service, leadership and character at GEHS and in the community. Applicants who meet the high expectations of members are invited to join the club at the annual induction ceremony in the fall of each school year. Members are required to maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher, complete and document at least 24 hours of volunteer service each school year, twelve per semester, attend all club meetings, and maintain the high standards of character and leadership which qualified them for membership.

## National Technical Honor Society (NTHS)
