of CEIS can be voluntary or mandatory.





Genre!

What in the world is a GENRE?

Genre is how books are categorized by similarities of content.

Books fall into two categories: Fiction and Non-Fiction Fiction and Non-Fiction are divided into more specific categories.

FICTION

Realistic Fiction — a story that uses made up characters but could happen in real life.

Historical Fiction — a fictional story that takes place in a particular period of time in the past. The time period and setting are real, but the characters are made up from the authors imagination.

Fantasy – a story including elements that are impossible including talking animals or magical powers.

Science Fiction – a type of fantasy that uses science and technology.

Mystery – a suspenseful story about a puzzling event that is not solved until the end of the story.

Traditional Literature – Stories that are passed down from one group to another in history from different cultures. This includes: folktales, fables, fairy tales, legends, myths, and tall tales.

NON-FICTION

<u>Informational</u> – Texts that provide facts about a variety of topics (sports, animals, science, history, careers, travel, geography, space, weather, etc.)

Autobiography – A story of a real person's life that is written by that person.

Biography – A story of a real person's life that was written by another person.

*Poetry – Verse written to create a response of thought and feeling from the reader. It often uses rhythm and rhyme.

*This doesn't really fit into either category. Some sources include it in Non-Fiction, while some put it in a separate category titled OTHER.
