

## PEETZ CONSEQUENCES FOR MAJOR BEHAVIOR VIOLATIONS

Major (Office Managed Behaviors)	Definitions and Consequences
Defiance/disrespect/ insubordination/ non-compliance	<p>Student engages in a high intensity or repeated refusal to follow directions, talks back and/or engages in intensely rude social interactions. Example: “No I will not do that and you cannot make me” yelled in a loud voice while pounding a desk.</p> <p>1st offense: lunch/recess detention, counselor and reflection paper 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: 3 lunch detention (same as above) 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: 1 day ISS, reflection paper and counselor</p>
Disruption	<p>Student engaged in a high Intensity or extended problematic behavior causing an interruption in an activity. Disruption includes sustained loud talk, yelling, or screaming; noise with materials; horseplay or roughhousing; and/or sustained out-of-seat behavior.</p> <p>1st offense: lunch/recess detention, counselor and reflection paper 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: 3 lunch detention (same as above) 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: 1 day ISS, reflection paper and counselor</p>
Abusive language/ inappropriate language/ profanity	<p>Verbal messages that include swearing, name calling or use of words in any inappropriate way (directed at someone). Example: Repeated use of name calling “retard”. Using “F” Bomb</p> <p>1st offense: lunch/recess detention, counselor and reflection paper 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: 3 lunch detention (same as above) 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: 1 day ISS, reflection paper and counselor</p>
Information and Other Electronics Technology Violation	<p>Student engages in inappropriate use of cell phone, pager, music/video players, camera, and/or computer.</p> <p>a. Accessing inappropriate material such as inappropriate pictures, audio’s with profanity or lewdness or sexual content using an electronic devices: 1 day of ISS and restrictions (and any legal consequences that apply)</p>
Fighting/ physical aggression	<p>Actions involving serious physical contact where injury may occur (e.g. repeated hitting, punching, hitting with an object, repeated kicking,).</p> <p>1<sup>st</sup> offense: sent home + 2 days of ISS 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: sent home that day + 5 days of ISS, notify police</p>

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	3 <sup>rd</sup> offense: sent home that day + 2 days of OSS, notify police
Property Damage	Student deliberately <i>impairs</i> the usefulness of property.(also includes “hacking”, sabotaging or spreading of viruses) 1 day of ISS and appropriate restitution and legal consequences 3 days of ISS for network sabotage plus restitution and any consequences
Dress Code	Student wears clothing that does not fit within the dress code guidelines or is gang/drug related. Example: clothing that displays drugs, tobacco, weapons, fire arms, of a sexual nature, obscene or is gang related 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense = ISS; conference with parent; change of clothing 3 <sup>rd</sup> offense =
Tardy	Student is late to class or the start up of the school day. This becomes a “major” when a student reaches 3 tardies no matter if they are excused or unexcused.
Forgery/Theft	Student is in possession of, having passed on, or being responsible for removing someone else’s property or has signed a persons name without that person’s permission. \$5.00 or greater ISS restitution is appropriate \$5.00 or less call parent meet with counselor restitution
Lying/Cheating	Student delivers message that are untrue and/or deliberately violates rules. Example: a. Student claims other’s homework as their own work. b. plagiarizing c. Lying that disrupts classroom learning  1 <sup>st</sup> offense: no credit for work; parent notification 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense: no credit for work; parent notification; loss of privileges
Other	Problem behavior causing this referral not listed above. Staff using this area will specify the problem behavior used.
Alcohol	Student is in possession of or is using alcohol (at school only).

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	1 <sup>st</sup> offense: 3 days of OSS, parent conference, 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense: 5 days of OSS (see school policy) 3 <sup>rd</sup> offense: recommend for expulsion.
Arson	Student plans and/or participates in malicious burning of property. Consideration for expulsion
Bomb Threat/False Alarm	Student delivers a message of possible explosive materials being on-campus, near campus, and/or pending explosion. Consider for Expulsion
Combustibles	Student is in possession of substances/objects readily capable of causing bodily harm and/or property damage (matches, lighters, firecrackers, gasoline, lighter fluid, aerosol products). Consideration for Expulsion
Harassment/Bullying	Student delivers <i>disrespectful messages</i> (verbal or gestural) to another person that includes threats and intimidation, obscene gestures, pictures, or written notes. <u>Disrespectful messages</u> include: negative comments based on race, religion, gender, age and/or national origin. Sustained or intense verbal attacks based on ethnic origin, disabilities or other personal matters. 1 <sup>st</sup> offense: call parent 1 day ISS counselor, reflection form 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense: call parent, 3 day ISS, counselor, reflection form 3 <sup>rd</sup> offense: call parent, 5 days ISS, counselor, reflection form
Inappropriate Display of Affection	Student engages in inappropriate verbal and/or physical gestures/contact, of a sexual nature to another student/adult, either consensual or non-consensual.
Other Drugs	Student is in possession of or is using illegal drugs/substances or imitations. 1 <sup>st</sup> offense: 3 days of OSS, parent conference, 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense: 5 days of OSS (see school policy) 3 <sup>rd</sup> offense: recommended for expulsion
Out of Bounds/Off School Location	Student is in an area that is outside of school boundaries without permission of the teacher (safety issue).

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Skip class/truancy	Student leaves class/school without permission or stays out of class/school without permission.
Tobacco	Student is in possession of or is using tobacco. 1 <sup>st</sup> offense = 1 day ISS refer to counselor 2 <sup>nd</sup> offense = 3 day ISS refer to counselor 3 <sup>rd</sup> offense = 1 day OSS, referral to appropriate agencies
Vandalism/Property Damage	Student participates in an activity that results in substantial destruction or disfigurement of property. Consider suspension and or expulsion
Weapons	Student is in possession of having knives or guns (real or look alike), or other objects readily capable of causing bodily harm. Mandatory Expulsion
