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AAGEA-AGEM Mentoring Program Description and Rationale:

Enlightened educators seeking to influence the field's future develop processes to enhance the incremental development of talent in the profession. AAGEA members know that continued professional growth benefits students, educators and administrators and that targeted relationships reinforce the application of professional development. Whether a member is interested in advanced curriculum, program design and evaluation, policy creation, or gifted education advocacy, members can become involved as a mentee or mentor in the Administrators for Gifted Education Mentoring (AAGEA-AGEM) Certificate Program.

The AAGEA-AGEM mentoring program was established to provide individualized professional growth opportunities for AAGEA members as a professional development service of the AAGEA organization. Leaders in the AAGEA organization are paired as mentors with members of AAGEA who are seeking to increase their level of expertise on a mutually interesting topic. Together they pursue a program of advanced learning in the field of gifted and talented education. The one-year experience culminates in the development of a meaningful project with results that can be shared with a wider AAGEA/AGATE membership audience. In addition, an AAGEA-AGEM Certificate of Recognition will be provided to mentees and mentors upon successful completion of their project.

The AAGEA-AGEM mentorship program was created to develop state-wide leaders in gifted education across the Natural State using a relationship-based mentoring and coaching design modeled after the national mentoring program of the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC) Professional Achievement Certificate. "Developing State Leaders in Arkansas Gifted Education with the Administrators for Gifted Education Mentoring (AAGEA-AGEM) Certificate Program" provides the structure for a grass-roots leadership development model utilizing in-state leaders at high levels of gifted education administrative roles across the state. The AGATE conference session will present information and applications for joining the AAGEA-AGEM program as a mentee and mentor. The AAGEA-AGEM roundtable session presented at the AAGEA Fall Workshop will showcase mentoring relationships and developed projects. AAGEA-AGEM provides the mechanism for connecting experienced leaders with new talent in the field thereby fostering positive connections across the state, the sharing of knowledge, understandings, practices, and developing leaders to impact the future of gifted education in Arkansas.

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Professional research literature supporting the mentoring process:



Mentoring is a nonjudgmental process built around planning conversations, observations, application, and reflecting conversations. Three major goals are components of mentoring and coaching: (1) establishing and maintaining trust, an assured reliance on the character, ability, or strength of someone; (2) facilitating mutual learning, the engagement and transformation of mental processes and perceptions; and (3) enhancing collective growth in two areas, as autonomous individuals and simultaneously acting interdependently within a group (Costa & Garmston, 2002). Furthermore, few educational approaches achieve the fullest impact without a mentoring/coaching component. The application of professional development workshops, lectures, and demonstrations increases to 90 percent when mentoring and coaching is integrated in the learning process (Joyce & Showers, 2002).

What is the Administrators for Gifted Education Mentoring Certificate Program?

The AAGEA-AGEM mentoring program is an individualized, mentored professional growth experience designed to increase expertise and leadership potential within the organization and across the state. **AAGEA-AGEM participants are paired with an experienced leader in gifted education and/or an AAGEA board mentor** (past or present) who is a state recognized leader in the field of gifted and talented education. Together you will pursue a program of advanced learning. As a mentor, you will coordinate an individually tailored one year program of professional growth filled with learning experiences based on mutually agreed upon goals. The program culminates in a professional portfolio that demonstrates expertise in four areas: knowledge, reflective understanding, problem solving, and dissemination/service in an area of interest related to gifted and talented education. The **AAGEA-AGEM program is available to all current members of AAGEA**: administrators, teachers, gifted education coordinators and specialists, counselors, parents, and provides a unique collaboration opportunity for everyone involved.

Qualifications of the Mentor

Mentors should demonstrate (1) current knowledge in their area of expertise, (2) active involvement in AAGEA and AGATE, gifted education task forces or other groups, (3) an ability to work collaboratively, (4) dedication and interest in facilitating the professional growth of colleagues in gifted and talented education, (5) current membership in AAGEA, and (6) an AAGEA board member- past or present.

How can you help?

Individuals with expertise in the following areas are in greatest demand: identification, social emotional needs, curriculum differentiation and modification, parenting, creativity, program development, program evaluation, special populations, early childhood, visual and performing arts, professional development, middle school, secondary education, public policy, technology, and student assessment.

Commitment of the Mentor

The mentoring term runs from September to September at the AAGEA Fall Workshop.

Mentors must be willing to engage in a one-year commitment which involves approximately 25 hours of conference time (phone, email, AGATE/AAGEA conference encounters) with their mentees.

It is anticipated that most communication will occur via email; however, the mentor must be available to meet with the mentee at two annual AAGEA fall workshops or an appropriate replacement professional venue. Each mentoring partnership will be expected to present their projects at the Fall Workshop and submit an article discussing their project to the AAGEAN newsletter. In addition, mentors must be willing to share their mentoring experience by helping train future mentors.

Each mentoring pair will be able to attend the second Fall Conference for half price of the conference fee.

Application Procedures

Potential AAGEA-AGEM Mentors supply the following information with their application form:

- 1. a personal letter addressing your experience in gifted education.
- 2. a current resume or curriculum vita demonstrating the mentor's professional expertise.
- 3. one letter of support written by a colleague attesting to the mentor's expertise in the areas indicated on the application, or a letter written by a former mentee attesting to a shared mentoring or related experience.

Qualifications of the Mentee

Mentees should demonstrate (1) involvement in the gifted education field, (2) current membership in AAGEA, (3) an ability to work collaboratively, (4) dedication and interest in working with a mentor for professional growth in gifted education, and (5) the identification of a goal-oriented problem that you wish to improve upon with mentoring in a specific related area of interest such as: identification, social emotional needs, curriculum differentiation and modification, parenting, creativity, program development, program evaluation, special populations, early childhood, visual and performing arts, professional development, middle school, secondary education, public policy, technology, and student assessment.

Commitment of the Mentee

The mentoring term runs from September to September at the AAGEA Fall Workshop. Mentees must be willing to engage in a one-year commitment which involves approximately 25 hours of conference time (phone, email, AGATE/AAGEA conference encounters) with their mentors. Mentoring program partners will meet to begin and conclude the program in September, ideally at two AAGEA Fall Workshops.
