
Our focus this spring in our strategic plan is to improve our learning opportunities for our students. We want to take this opportunity to share about some of these initiatives that Centennial is working on.

We are wanting to start back up the alumni tournaments here at Centennial High School. We are planning on having a basketball tournament in the East gym and a volleyball tournament in the West gym on Saturday, March 25th starting @ 8:00 AM.




#### State Officer Visit

- Individuals must be a Centennial graduate and have left school in good standing

- Individuals are not eligible for nomination until five years after graduation or service to the school
- A team may be nominated as an entity, but is not eligible for nomination until five years after graduation
