Lockland Local School District is on the rise! We strive to ensure that all children have the opportunity to reach their maximum potential inside and outside of the classroom.

Our Quality Profile highlights our school district in areas that matter most in our community.

- Increased 4-year graduation rate by more than 15% in the last three years.
- Development and implementation of a local literacy plan that drives the district's reading, writing, speaking, and listening goals in all classes. This literacy plan is the driving force behind our improvement plan and our competitive grant applications.
- Invested in 21st century technology for all students in grades K-12. The district has invested in IT infrastructure and new Chromebook devices for all students and staff over the last three years.



- Development of curriculum and acquisition of new instructional resources in all core areas for grades K-12 over the last three years. of partnerships with multiple mental health agencies to support all students in grades K-12.
- 100% of teaching staff are qualified and licensed to teach all grades levels/content areas.
- Development of a district app that streamlines our web page, Facebook, Twitter and push notification systems for increased levels of communication and transparency.
- Creation of a high school master schedule that provides 25 new course offerings for students in grades 9-12 with a focus on African American studies, technology, business, marketing, science, math and technology.



- Increase in student enrollment by nearly 20% over the last three years.
- Achievement with the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. All of Lockland's K-3 students are monitored with a Reading Improvement Plan each year to ensure success. More than 98% of 3rd graders were promoted to the 4th grade based on their literacy achievement over the past three years.

Student Services

A variety of services provide options to ensure all students receive enrichment and support.

- Creation of after-school programs with competitive grant funding. All Lockland students in grades 7-12 have the opportunity to participate in after-school and summer programming designed to ensure success.
- Development and implementation of a community service and field experience program for students. All students in high school visit multiple colleges, universities, businesses and gain exposure to all branches of the United States military as a part of our 3 E's initiative--**Enrolled, Employed or Enlisted for EVERY graduate!**
- All students in grades K-12 now experience opportunities to learn outside of the school via field trips to businesses, colleges, museums, etc. throughout the tri-state area.
- Fostering of a safe learning environment by having a School Resource Officer in all three schools, five days per week throughout the school year.



Community Partnerships

Educational experiences are enhanced by partnerships between the school district and community.

- Collaboration with the Village of Lockland, local businesses, and non-profit organizations to enhance the opportunities and resources available for all students grades K-12.
- Participation in the United Way of Greater Cincinnati Success by Six partnership to increase child find efforts, preschool exposure, and kindergarten readiness for all children ages 0-5 in our community.
- Partnership with the YMCA of Cincinnati to provide educational opportunities for students outside of the typical school day.
- Partnership with the Adopt A Class organization to provide mentorship, tutoring, and partners in education to support our K-6 classrooms.
- Partnership with the Reading Lockland Youth Football League so students in Lockland can participate in quality athletic experiences.



Facilities

In May 2019, the community overwhelmingly supported a bond issue to renovate our campus.

The district is now eligible to partner with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission to co-fund this \$30 million renovation project to create a 21st century environment for all students and staff.



Fiscal Responsibility

Financial responsibility ensures that the majority of funding is spent on classroom instruction.

- Reorganization of the administrative team for increased efficiency and cost savings.
- Evaluation of district operations resulting decreased costs in the areas of food service, maintenance, and technology services.
- Earned more than \$2.25 million in competitive grant dollars over the last three years. These grant dollars have helped fund after-school and summer programs, school quality improvement, community outreach and literacy programs in grades K-12.
