

Greenfield R-IV School District Virtual Education

MOCAP General Information:

The district will pay the costs of a virtual course only if the district has first approved the student's enrollment in the course as described in district policy.

The district is not required to provide students access to or pay for courses beyond the equivalent of full-time enrollment.

The district will provide supervision for students who take virtual courses in district facilities but will not provide supervision for students taking virtual courses offsite.

Participating students will be able to select from a set of pre-approved vendors.

Students will complete all coursework on campus.

Students taking courses virtually are subject to district policies, procedures and rules applicable to students enrolled in traditional courses including, but not limited to, the district's discipline code and prohibitions on academic dishonesty, discrimination, harassment, bullying and cyberbullying.

All grades received through virtual education will be recorded on the student's academic transcript.

Extracurricular eligibility will be determined according to MSHSAA requirements.

Student Eligibility To be considered eligible, students must be:

Enrolled and residing in the Greenfield R-IV School the previous semester.

Currently enrolled and residing in the Greenfield R-IV School District in the current semester for which the virtual courses will be taken.

Self-motivated and technologically proficient.

All prerequisites as listed in the course descriptions must be met.

Enrollment must be approved by district administration.

Enrollment: Enrollment criteria for virtual education programming is as followed:

Enrollment requests will be made to the school counselor.

A student or parent/guardian must notify the counselor and principal before the student may enroll in a district-sponsored virtual course or a MOCAP virtual course through the district.

A face-to-face meeting with the building administration, parents, and student must be conducted prior to admission to the virtual education courses to determine the best fit for the student.

The High School principal will determine whether enrollment in a virtual course is in the best educational interest of a student. If the Principal deems that it is not the student will be informed in writing of the decision. At this point a parent may appeal the decision in accordance with district policy.

Students will enroll in virtual classes during the regular student enrollment period for the upcoming semester.

Students must be enrolled in or withdraw from the virtual program within the first five school days of a given semester.

Virtual education students are expected to complete all elements of the assigned course work within the same timeline as the typical district seated coursework (quarter and/or semester).

Enrollment in virtual courses is not allowed for the purposes of earning credits beyond full-time status.

To maintain enrollment in the virtual education program, students must complete the following:

A minimum of 30 hours of work per week or progress at the pace prescribed by the vendor.

Complete each course assigned with a passing grade by the end of the grading period (quarter/semester).

Students who do not fulfill these two requirements will not be allowed to continue in the virtual program the following grading period.

Other Information Related to Greenfield R-IV School District Virtual Education (MOCAP):

Completed virtual courses will be counted as no less than 95% attendance in compliance with A+ standards.

Virtual education program students must remain on track for graduation. Therefore, course work should support graduation requirements as noted in the district student handbook.

Students enrolled in virtual education courses will complete any MAP or end-of-course exams associated with the virtual course as required by DESE.

District administration reserves the right to enroll or withdraw any student from the virtual education program if it is in the best interest of the student.
