

The purpose of summer school shall be to maximize student growth and achievement through accelerated, continuous, and engaging learning. Courses offered in the summer school shall be based on needs and interests of students, including credit recovery for students at the high school level.

All students who reside in the District during the summer session may attend the summer school program, including home-school and private school students. Summer school shall be provided without cost to District residents, except for a nominal fee to cover the cost of materials used in class. Such fees shall be payable upon registration. Students enrolled in summer school shall be expected to attend on a daily basis. Elementary and middle school students who miss five (5) days of summer school attendance will no longer be considered an enrolled student in the program unless there are extenuating circumstances; High School students seeking credit recovery who are absent two (2) days or more of summer school attendance will no longer be considered an enrolled student in the program.

Permissive summer school differs from extended school year (ESY) services offered under a child's Individual Education Plan (IEP). Eligibility for these services as well as the scope of services is determined by the IEP team.

The District shall not discriminate on the basis of sex, age, race, religion, color, national origin, homeless status, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
