# Our Path Topic

Over the last couple of years, WASD has implemented an Attendance Committee to look at ways to monitor, improve and incentivize student and staff attendance. Student and staff attendance is part of our strategic plan. For good reason, students learn better, when they and the everyday teacher are in class.

#### Student Attendance

- Nine (9) of every 100 students (9%) are on pace to miss 10% of the school year. The 2018/19 school year saw 10% of students missed 10% of the school year.
- The Check and Connect program, incentives and other programs are in place to try to improve student attendance. In addition, the county agencies and district magistrate have been involved working with WASD to explore ways to improve student attendance.

#### Professional Staff Attendance

- In 2018/19—73 of 286 (26%) of our professional staff used more than nine (9) sick days. Seventy-four (74%) of our professional staff attended work 95% of the school year (not including professional, personal or emergency days). Thirteen (13) professional staff had perfect attendance last year.
- In 2019/20—22% of our professional staff have used three (3) sick days the first quarter of this school year. This does not include personal, professional or emergency days. If the pace continues, 22% (63) of the professional staff will miss 12 sick days this year.
- According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics (2018), the absence rate for a full-time wage and salary workers is **2.8%** (both private and public sectors)--reasons—Illness, Burnout, Childcare, Family & Personal Obligations, and Tardiness. In **2015**, the **School District of Philadelphia** reported an absenteeism rate for **professional staff at 6.1%**--more than twice the national average.
- The committee continues to explore ways to improve staff attendance.
- The WASD has added an on-site (high school) WellSpan Convenience Health Center for easy access with little to no waiting. In addition, WASD is working to implement a staff childcare facility.
- The committee will have a survey go out to staff this year to help understand the challenges and learn how to improve.
