A. Student Success Act

The Student Success Act (SSA) is the largest investment in the last 30 year in the state of Oregon towards education. The SSA is about equity and focusing on serving students that have traditionally been underserved. The resources allocation given to the district will be aided by feedback from the staff, parents, community members, and students. SWCSD will be holding community engagement meetings in Wamic, Simnasho, Tygh Valley and Maupin to gather feedback from the community. The district website will also have a survey for students, parents, staff and community members to give feedback on how to allocate and best support students if they cannot attend one of the community engagement meetings.

B. Climate Survey Review

Board discussed the different positive and opportunities in the Tell and Climate Survey. Union representative stated that the Tell survey only surveys the certified staff so all other groups within the district's data is not captured. His recommendation was to go with Survey Monkey so all populations can be captured. The board decided it would be beneficial that all staff should be surveyed. Currently we have an EA and Certified Survey Monkey but we would need to create a Classified survey. Superintendent Wraught stated that many small districts do not use the TELL survey. Being a small district and with an "open door" policy the staff is always welcome to visit with the administration. Our goal of the district is to have an environment where we can all collaboratively communicate to come up with solutions to our opportunity areas. A survey does not necessarily fulfill that goal solely. The next step is to take the TELL survey create a version with the same questions for the classified staff with a N/A option for questions that only pertain to the certified staff.

C. Student Representative

A student representative would play a role as a representative for the student body on the school board. Then the student would go back to their peers to report back. This would also be a starting point to gear toward a "student court" where students discuss student issues and understand student policy. It would provide a growth and learning opportunity for students. The student would not be a voting member.
