BUILDING UPDATES SUMMER 2016

Millville Elementary: New carpet in the main office and two entryways to meet the insurance requirements. Paid for by BICO rental income.

FWHMS: Extending existing vent stack to correct poor air quality. Has been an ongoing problem affecting employee health. Paid for out of maintenance budget. Sign looks great at the bottom of the driveway, paid for by donations.

BMRHS: Guidance department relocates back to original long time location next to main office and this will address the NEACS finding. Curriculum and SPED move to former Guidance location above LMC. Replaced carpet in main office to meet insurance requirements. Will be paid for by BICO rental income.

In all schools, custodial staff has done their usual amazing job of painting, micro cleaning surfaces, resurfacing gym floors, and rehabbing each school top to bottom for opening day. This work is done in the heat of the summer in uncomfortable conditions and the care and effort they bring to the job shows in the attention to detail throughout all schools.

Re: Textbook Adoption

Middle School Math Textbook – This past spring the middle school math teachers' piloted two math series to follow the Elementary EnVisions Math series adopted last year. As it is our intent to increase the vigor and viability of our math programing across the district, we choose two excellent math programs, Envisions (Middle School edition) and Big Ideas Math. The overwhelming choice of the teaching staff, after close consideration of all aspects of the two programs was the Big Ideas Math. This program is used by several other districts to follow specifically the EnVisions program and has been met with great success. Furthermore, this program has the additional feature of an advanced text as an option for those excelling in the math program. It is our belief that this program will continue the pursuit of the higher level of math and overall achievement that is expected with the newer math standards. We would be implementing this program in stages starting with grade 6 this year, 7th next year, and grade 8 in FY 18.

I ask that the committee vote to adopt this new program for use at the middle school level.
