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

What is Title I?

Ware County Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Ware County Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Ware County Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Ware County Middle will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Ware County Middle School invites all parents to review and provide input and comments at any time regarding our parent and family engagement policy. Additionally, our plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and through various social media outlets to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings, School Improvement Team meetings, and activities during the school year including our annual Curriculum Night and Milestone Mania events. Parents have opportunities to provide feedback on the School-Wide Plan, School-Parent Compact, and family engagement budget.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Ware County Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in our welcome packet that is given to all students. The plan is also available on the school website, social media outlets, and from the Parent Engagement Coordinator, Mrs. Alicia Crawford. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center located in our Media Center.

2019-20 District Goal

Increase academic achievement in ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies 3% in proficient and distinguished on Georgia Milestones in FY20.

2019-20 School Goal

Increase by 3 percentage points the number of students performing on grade level in all content areas (Math, Science, Social Studies, and ELA) as measured by GMAS Spring test administration.

2019-20 Area of Emphasis

Acquire and use new vocabulary using all appropriate resources.

Ware County Middle will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
