Gold Out was brought to Coahoma ISD in 2018 by Bulldogs Head Football Coach Chris Joslin and his wife, Kristen. While employed at Rockdale High School, Chris worked for the school's head football coach Jeff Miller, Angela's husband.

Both Chris and Kristen watched as the Miller's son, Gunner, fought an aggressive form of bone cancer called Ewing's sarcoma. Gunner was diagnosed his freshman year in high school but has since gone into remission. He is now a freshman at Texas Tech University.

Coahoma ISD announced the final totals for this year's campaign on Oct. 24, during the varsity football between the Bulldogs and Stanton Buffaloes.

Although Coahoma High School colors are red and white, Bulldog

fans were encouraged to wear their Gold Out shirts to show support for the fundraiser. The varsity football team wore special gold and red uniforms.

During the pre-game ceremonies, school officials honored three children whose lives were impacted by cancer by naming them

honorary captains, and they or their representatives joined the Bulldogs for the traditional coin toss at midfield.

Honorary captains were Gunner Miller, who was represented by Trinady Joslin and Zoie Joslin; the late Briella Heranandez, who was represented by the Quiroz family and her sister, Eliana; and six-year-old Serenity with her

family. Serenity was diagnosed at 5 years old with leukemia. She went into remission on Sept. 6 and continues her treatments every 10 days in Lubbock. Her last day of treatment is set for Oct. 17, 2021.

Since its founding five years ago, Teaming Up has donated more than \$250,000 to fund childhood cancer research.
