The board also discussed the kitchen equipment in Bushton and the possibility of using it elsewhere in the district.

Mr. Clark reviewed the district's 5-year capital outlay plan and the various items that have been completed. He also reviewed other capital outlay items that have yet to be completed and prioritizing these items. The administrators will work to update the capital outlay plan for the next five years as follows: 2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25.

Discuss Capital Outlay items

Mr. Clark reported that Central Plains Elementary School was one of six Kansas schools designated 2019 National Blue Ribbon Schools, by the U.S. Secretary of Education. There are only 362 schools in the nation designated as 2019 National Blue Ribbon Schools. CPES was recognized as an Exemplary Achievement Gap Closing School, which is among the state's highest performing schools in closing achievement gaps between a school's subgroups and all students. The U.S. Dept. of Education will formally recognize the 362 schools at an awards ceremony Nov. 14-15, 2019 in Washington, D.C.
