#### K-8 Art!

Happy October! The students & I have had loads of fun creating together so far! In **Kindergarten**, our little guys finished up our overlapping circles in the style of artist Wassily Kandinsky. Ask them about our "maROOOn" paper! With 1st graders, a handy primary colors song was introduced to help remember primary colors! Following that, the kids made a collage in the style of Piet Mondrian & noticed he typically only used primary colors. In 2nd grade, an elephant festival is underway as we discuss the annual parade in India! Our 3rd graders can tell you all about the steps our Huichol tribe uses to create original yarn paintings! Colors & symbols are used to tell stories through generations. 4th & 5th grade are listing the meanings of the five colors seen in African Kente cloths. Then, they are choosing colors for their own paper weaving similar to the cloths. 6th through 8th graders utilized collaboration with individual techniques as they each created portions of a larger mural-like banner for our hallway! Connecting with that same grid method, our older students then created pixel art of their choice & incorporated the lined style in order to keep their artwork organized. A giant thank you goes out to all of you for the warm welcome I am experiencing as your child's new art teacher! More to come next time!

#### Social Work Update

#### Hi Bulldogs!

This year, we have started off with discussing school rules, teamwork, and expected behaviors by teaching our PBIS standards using the PAWS (k-5) and BARK (6-8) acronyms for student behavior pictured below. Our junior high students became teachers for the k-5 classes as they walked throughout the building and learned about expectations in places such as the cafeteria, playground, hallway, library, and bathrooms. We are excited to start a buddy up program in October! Junior high students will be paired with elementary students for the year to participate in fun monthly activities.

8th graders are getting ready to head to Lorado Taft for an afternoon of team building as a part of SEL class. They have been learning about personal strengths, mental and physical health, as well as diversity and acceptance. On October 14th, our first quarter will end with the junior high students celebrating their hard work. Students who have all of their work turned in, are passing all of their classes, and have two or fewer detentions will participate in an afternoon of fun. We will have this type of celebration on the final day of each quarter.

In September, the school focused on respect as our characteristic of the month. Students discussed ways to show respect to others, to themselves, and to objects. In October, we will learn about growth mindset and the power of vet.

It has been a wonderful start to our year!
