Our Path Topic

On November 1st, 2019, WASD officially opened its Early Learning Center (former D Wing) at the high school. There were several state and local dignitaries present. In addition, WellSpan officially opened its Convenience Center in the same wing.

Prior to the event, First Start Partnerships (formerly Head Start of Franklin County) held its annual meeting at the Waynesboro Country Club. The keynote speaker was Jesse McCree the CEO of South Central Workforce Board (SCPAWorks--second largest workforce board in PA). The SCPAWorks is an organization for business development through community partnerships, training and education.

Mr. McCree spoke about early childhood education. He said there are two areas that industry and business know are important factors in our economic development, and are a focus for them—early childhood education and career education. Mr. McCree stated that the beginning and the end are workforce investments. He was adamant that business is realizing the importance of early childhood education and the development of a productive workforce. The first three years of a child's life are so critical to one's development and future, he continued. The investment of early childhood is the key ingredient to a strong and successful society and workforce in the future.

Mr. McCree was very aware of what WASD is trying to accomplish with *First Choice*. He said we are developing what he believes will be best practices. Pleased by what he heard about WASD's *First Choice* vision, he asked if he could attend the ribbon cutting of the early learning center.

Although we are just beginning our journey with *First Choice*, we have to remember that it is a journey and never has an end. We will always get closer to our vision and make great accomplishments, but we will never arrive at our end vision, because it should continue to change over time. That is okay. Great organizations are not finite. They are constantly reinventing and developing their vision.
