JROTC - Honor Unit with Distinction

Once again, the Old Town High School Coyote Battalion has been successful in their quest to achieve the coveted status of "Honor Unit with Distinction." We have held this position since we were first eligible in 2006.

Every three years, the battalion goes through a formal inspection, JROTC Program Accreditation (JPA). They must score a 95 or better during that review. Additionally, each year points are earned for participating in various activities i.e. drill, parades, Color Guard etc. Our unit report which is submitted in June each year records these events. We always max out the scoring with 400 points annually.

This distinction sustains the unit through the 2019-2020 school year. There are (5) Army program in the state of Maine and OTHS is one of only two with this distinction. It is a lot of work for First Sergeant Joel Peaslee and Colonel Szewc, but also a lot of work and participation on the students' part. The battalion numbers have rebounded back up to 83 cadets this year, which is a high for Colonel Szewc's eight-year term to date. We are proud of this unique and productive program at OTHS.

The Gary Gordon Invitational

On Saturday, October 5th, the Old Town High School JROTC Coyote Battalion hosted their 15th Annual Drill Competition in MacKenzie Gymnasium. Several members of the battalion recently conducted some research around local Medal of Honor winners and they became intrigued by the story of Gary Gordon. They then decided to commit to a series of fund-raisers over the course of this school year to assist the town of Lincoln in raising enough money to erect a statue in his honor. Further, they have decided to rename the annual competition in honor of Master Sergeant Gary Gordon. In the opening ceremony of the competition this past October, they made the name change public and invited Gary's mother, Betty (my aunt) and Gary's sister, Robin (my cousin) to the event. They were extremely touched by the fact that our students chose to honor Gary in this way and they provided a picture and approval of the plaque design.
