 - 3.1 Discussion The communication between the Superintendent and the Bishop Unified School District Board of Trustees.

Dual Language Program-The Board and Superintendent discussed concerns about having fully qualified candidates for teaching in our dual language program. Specifically, we had no qualified applicants for our 3rd grade opening and we discussed options.

- 1. Continue recruiting qualified candidates and increase outreach efforts
- 2. Ask EL Coordinator to voluntarily take a reassignment back to the classroom
- 3. Cancel Kindergarten dual language option and reassign the teacher to 3rd grade

The Board directed the Superintendent to exhaust all recruitment efforts including offering an "intern" program to candidates. In addition, the Board would like an update on the effectiveness of the program and directed the Superintendent to work with the EL Coordinator to begin collecting data to present to the Board in Spring of 2020. NWEA Maps — is a computer-adaptive assessment tests produced by the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA). The test are designed for K-12 grade students and assess reading/language/math and for some students general science.

Attendance – printouts from dated today with TK-5th grade enrollment numbers and class sizes LCAP Goals – Goal 1: Prepare students with the skills necessary to excel in college and career, Goal 2: Increase the quality of instruction for all students by deepening implementation of the common core state standards, Goal 3: Ensure all students populations achieve annual measurable academic growth by providing targeted additional support in literacy and math and Goal 4: Implement a plan to improve student safety and connectedness to school.

BUSD Focus Goals – 50% at or above grade level in ELA and Math and 96% attendance rate.

3.2 Discussion - The Superintendent and Bishop Unified School District Board of Trustees setting procedures.

Board discussed priority was to analyze any and all programs to look for ways to decrease class sizes. The goal is class sizes of TK-5 grade 20/1 and 6-12 grades 25/1.
