#### Our Path Topic

The 2019/20 school year is far into the second quarter, and now approaching weather-challenging days. The decisions for closing, dismissing early, and arriving late are not made without significant thought and research.

The area superintendents discuss the imposing weather threats to share concerns and thoughts. Although they work together to be somewhat consistent, each district has unique characteristics that may result in a different decision. The superintendent usually consults with transportation officials and buildings & grounds supervisors (who also consult with townships and boroughs). Also, sometimes consulted are PennDot and National Weather Service officials. PennDot plows are tracked to see if or when the state roads have been plowed.

#### For staff:

- Two-hour Delays (Professional)—teachers may arrive to school two-hours later than typical day.
- **Two-hour Delays (Support)**—paraprofessionals may arrive two-hours later, but must talk with their supervisor about how to make up their lost time.
- Early Dismissals (Professional)—teachers may leave after students have been dismissed and cleared, and finished necessary duties.
- Early Dismissals (Support)—paraprofessionals may leave after students are dismissed, but must talk to supervisor in order to make up lost time due to the early dismissal.
- Cafeteria and Maintenance Staff depend on the requirements of those inclement weather days. These folks are considered essential employees that may be required to fulfill services needed during inclement weather events.
- Closures—school closures due to weather events will be announced through the BoroBlast, WASD website, public notices, etc. Some essential employees may be required to work due to the nature of their positions.
- **Possible Snow Make Up Days** (Please remember these are required days if needed. Please consider these days when scheduling vacations).
  - o February 17
  - o March 16
  - o April 9
  - o June 1 and after if needed.

- In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln declared Thanksgiving a national holiday. Sara J. Hale (known for her poem Mary Had a Little Lamb) lobbied in the 1840s for Thanksgiving to become a national holiday. Her dream came true in 1863.
- In 1989, President George H.W. Bush pardoned the first White House turkey.
- The average US person consumes 3000-4500 calories on Thanksgiving. A pound is 3500 calories.
