MHS Graduation Requirements

English	20 credits
Math	20 credits
Science	15 credits
History	15 credits (5 credits US History)
World Language	10 credits (of same language)
PE	3.75 credits (PE 9 & 10)
Fine Arts (includes art, music, communications)	5 credits
Senior Project	5 credits

You must earn 110 credits to graduate Pass MCAS Science, ELA, & Math

General Application Requirements

- Application-CommonApp, CoalitionApp, Institution's Application-includes Essay
- Official Transcript-must be sent from our office
- Letters of Recommendation- No more than 2 from teachers and 1 from your School Counselor
- **Information from your Resume** extracurriculars, community service, awards/recognitions, leadership
- Application fee-fee waivers available
- *Standardized test scores*-many schools are not requiring these for Fall 2024
- Interviews, portfolios, Honors Programs, recommended or optional=do it!

Making your College List

- Academic programs majors and minors
 - If you considering a few different majors, make sure that the college you choose offers all of them!
- Size 2,000 students is considered a small college, but that is 5 times bigger than MHS!-this is hard to imagine
- Location how far from home? Keep transportation in mind! (additional \$)
- Setting rural, suburban, urban
- Residential vs commuter campus
- Activities & Student Life intramural sports, clubs, honors societies, etc.
- Cost-Public schools in MA are usually most affordable

My College List

- 1. Log in to MEFA Pathway (you created an account 9th grade in Intro to Capstone)
- 2. Click on the **Search Colleges** Tab
- 3. Click on **Get Started**
- 4. In the left hand column you are going to be selecting search options to create a list
- 5. Click on *Save to List* on the right to add them to *My College List*

Researching Schools

- Research schools before applying-How
 - Create a list to narrow down where you need to research-select Safety,
 Target, Reach schools-consider academics & financials
 - Visit the schools' websites
 - College Search websites-MEFA Pathway and College Board BigFuture
 - Participate in virtual visits, webinars, live chat with admissions; follow on social media
 - Visit in person-April vacation great time
 - College fairs- May 2nd and 3rd NACAC in Boston, NEACAC May 16th at Assumption University
- How many will you apply to? 6-8, family decision

What to research?-Is this a good fit for me?

- Application Deadlines
- Cost of Attendance including Room & Board before financial aid
- Average Financial Aid Package of students who attend
- Your program/major
- Student Life
- Disability services
- Experience of the students who go there
- What interests me about this school? What makes it unique?
- Admission Requirements/criteria
- What is the school looking for? GPA, Rigor, test scores, etc?

Testing

- Many colleges are still test-optional for the Class of 2024 admissions cycle - find the list <u>here</u>
- Upcoming SAT dates May 6-April 7th deadline to register,
 June 3, late August, early Oct., early Nov., early Dec.
- Upcoming ACT dates June 10, July 15, Sept. 9, Oct. 28, Dec. 9
- Difference between SAT and ACT
- Fee waivers available

What can you do now?

- Meet with your School Counselor (parents are invited!)
- Get started on your Counselor Brag Sheet, Teacher Recommendation Forms
- Continue your college search
 - https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/
 - o Peterson's, Princeton Review, etc.
- Research schools you are interested in and find out:
 - Deadlines; type of application (Common App, Coalition, school); app requirements; testing requirements, # of recs, etc.
 - Financial Aid deadline and requirements (FAFSA, CSS Profile)
 - Cost of Attendance=Tuition, Fees, Room & Board
- Get started on your essay
- Think about teachers for your recommendations
