BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Palmyra Board of Education hereby includes in the proposed budget the adjustment for increases in costs of health benefits in the amount of \$133,810. The additional funds are included in the base budget and will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefits; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Palmyra Board of Education hereby includes in the proposed budget the adjustment for banked cap in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-10.3(b). The district has fully exhausted all eligible statutory spending authority and must increase the base budget in the amount of \$65,190 for necessary operational costs that must be completed by the end of the budget year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that included in the general fund appropriations is \$289,544 for deposit into the Board of Education's approved Capital Reserve Account for future funding of Architectural design work and projects outlined in the District's Long Range Facilities Plan (LRFP) in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7G-31 and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-8.4. The amount represents expenditures for construction elements or projects that exceed the facilities efficiency standards necessary to achieve the New Jersey student learning standards; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$20,925.00 for the 2017-18 budget year for all staff and board members; and
