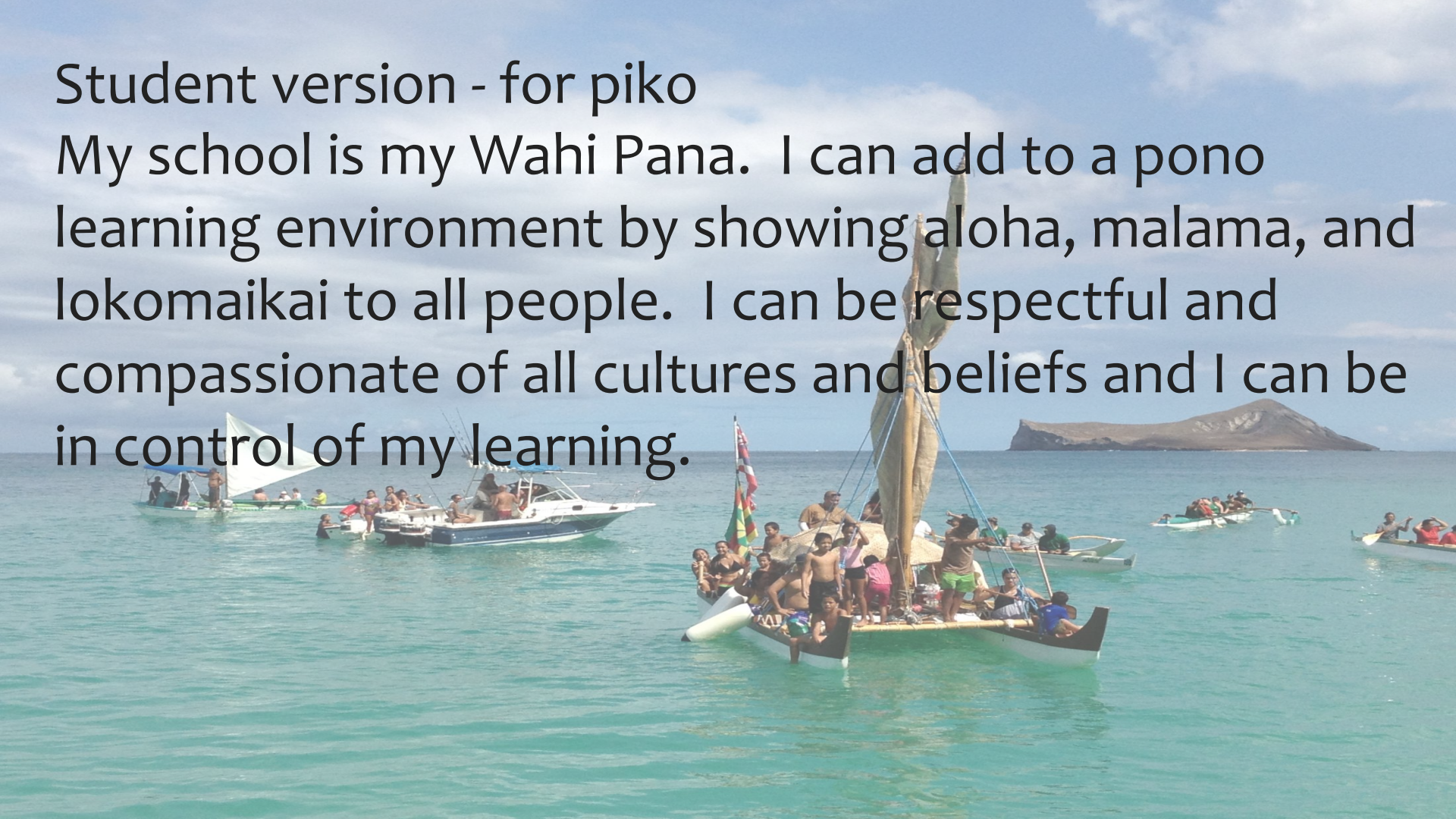
Promise

Oct 2022 Update Summary

- 1) Masks INDOORS is **highly recommended**
- 2) Daily health check **and temp check** is no longer mandatory
- 3) 5 day isolation if COVID POSITIVE
- 4) If you are ill **with a negative test/doctors note and 24 hours symptom free can return to school.**
- 5) As changes occur, MHPCS policies will be updated to most appropriately follow state and CDC requirements.
