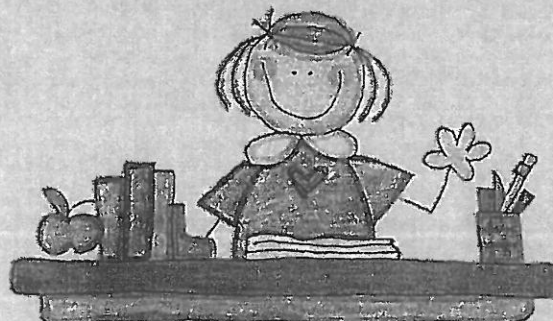

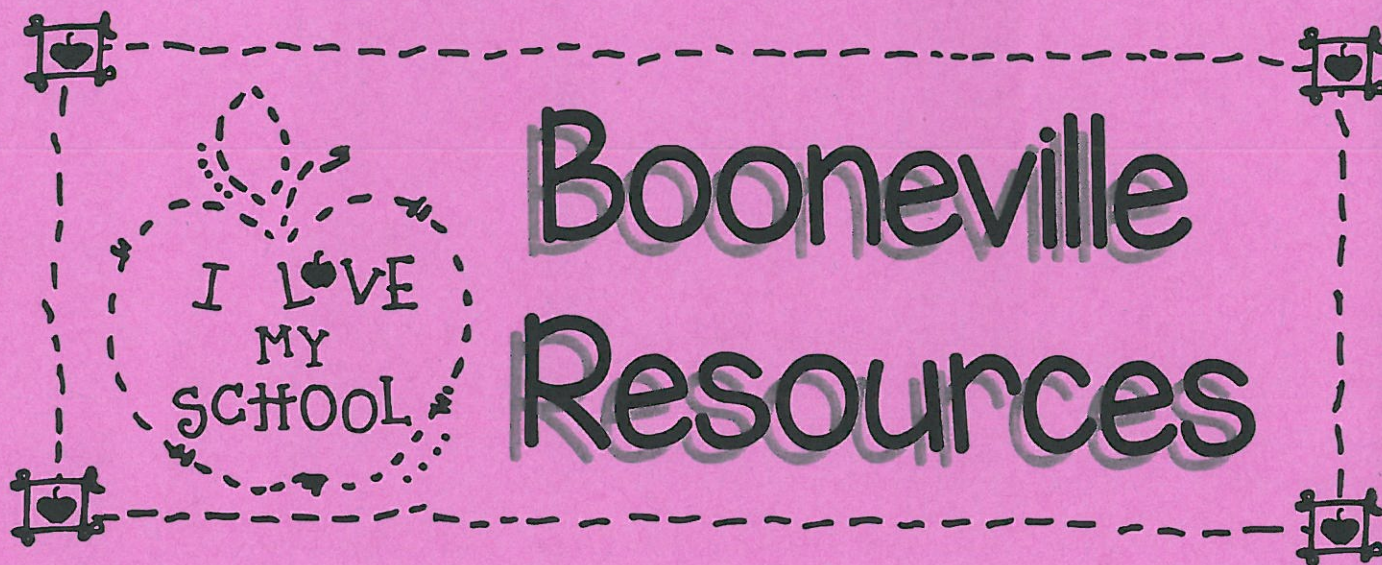

ACCESSING STUDENT INFORMATION VIA HOME ACCESS CENTER (HAC)



Parents & Students,

The Home Access Center (HAC), to view student school information over the internet, has been upgraded.

To access HAC, go to <http://hac40.esp.k12.ar.us/> or use the link on the district website www.booneville.k12.ar.us - Grades.

Users must select **Booneville School System** from the drop-down menu and enter the login and password. Login and passwords are the same each year and can be obtained from the office of the school your child attends.

Users may change their passwords and modify challenge questions in **My Account**. Hover over the user name in the HAC banner and then select **My Account**.

In the upgraded version of HAC, users will be able to subscribe and change settings for types of alerts to receive about students. To display the **My Alerts** page, hover over the user name in the upper right hand corner of the screen of the Home Access Center banner and select **My Alerts**. To receive emails, guardians must subscribe to alerts in HAC and must have a valid email address registered in the office.

Registration: Users are asked to review the information in the **Registration** section of HAC to verify that all information is accurate and current. If your information changes at any time, please contact the office.

Users may Logoff by selecting **Logoff** from the upper banner.

Tornado Shelter Guidelines / Rules

- ▶ The tornado shelter located on the school grounds of Booneville Elementary School is the property of the Booneville School District and is designed to house not only students and staff members, but also a limited number of community residents during a tornado event. When school is not in session, the opening of the building will be handled by a contact person designated by the school district or an appropriate backup. At all other times the building will be utilized by school personnel and monitored by the school principal(s).
- ▶ The shelter will be opened to the public only when there is a TORNADO WARNING issued for our area of Logan County by the National Weather Service and/or the Tornado Sirens in the City of Booneville have sounded. A "Tornado Watch" will alert the appropriate personnel that the building may need to be opened if the weather situation worsens. Thunderstorm Warnings are not to be considered as Tornado Warnings.
- ▶ The shelter will remain open until the TORNADO WARNING is lifted. When the TORNADO WARNING is lifted, the shelter must be evacuated.
- ▶ The shelter of school children will take priority over the sheltering of adults. In the event of a TORNADO WARNING during school hours, community members will only be admitted to the shelter AFTER ALL students have been moved into the shelter. At the shelter on the Booneville Elementary grounds, there will be room for approximately 130 community residents after all students and school staff has entered the shelter. Community members and students will be separated while in the shelter during school hours.
- ▶ No pets.
- ▶ The directions of the School Administrators and/or the Shelter Manager must be adhered to at all times.
- ▶ Smoking and/or use of tobacco products is NOT ALLOWED inside the shelter. Arkansas Code 6-21-609 states "Smoking or use of tobacco products in any form is prohibited in, or on, any property owned or leased by a public school district. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100)."

Dear 6th Grade Music Student and Parents:

Welcome to 6th Grade Music! I am looking forward to making music together with you this year. We have a big year ahead of us, so here are a few things that will hopefully help things run smoothly so we can focus on becoming the best MUSICIANS we can be.

What we will learn ...

So far in K-5 music you have learned a lot about note names, rhythms, and how to make music. This year we will take our music reading skills to the next level with **RECORDER KARATE** !! We will use our music-reading skills to learn to play the recorder and will even get to earn Recorder Karate Belts. We will show off our skills in our Recorder Karate Performance in the spring (you will receive more information later). You should have received an order form for your very own Recorder Karate Recorder. Please be sure to send it back as soon as possible so that we can get started. We will also get to sing, learn to play keyboards and Pbuzz instruments, and will explore other instruments as well.

How we will be graded ...

Music is a once-a-week participation class, therefore attendance is very important. Students receive up to 20 points each week for following instructions well and doing the best they can to be the best musician they can be. Students may also receive grades for assignments or tests (including the performance) that give me an indication of their individual understanding. They will be thoroughly prepared for these grades well in advance. Students will be given sheet music and booklets to take home and practice. Students who are absent from music class for any reason will receive zero participation points BUT will have a chance to earn those points back by completing a make up assignment. The assignment can be obtained from me or from the home room teacher and will need to be turned in to me by the next music class. Points will be deducted from make up assignments that are late. The make up assignment will be as relevant as possible to the lesson missed, but since it is not possible for a written assignment to truly do justice to a music participation class, students need to be in attendance as much as possible.

How we can communicate with one another ...

Parents and Teachers are a TEAM ... we work together to help our children, our students, to be the best they can be. If you ever have questions or concerns or just want to get to know me, please feel free to contact me directly.
