# SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER By Dr. Douglas DeSchepper

Greetings from the District Office. It is hard to believe we are in the month of October already. A Community Open House has been scheduled for Monday, October 21 from 5:00-7:00 p.m. There will be a scheduled presentation at 5:00 p.m. in the New Multi-Purpose Facility. Everyone is invited to attend the presentation and visit the entire building. During the presentation, there will be a separate presentation on the new NEC Technology for front of the classroom technology. Orangeville School District is very fortunate to be the first school in the Nation to have this technology in every classroom in the entire building. Additional technology will also be present in the building that evening.

During the Community Open House, we would like to recognize companies and individuals responsible in the construction projects. Following the presentations, we are also planning self tours for everyone to visit the new construction, remodeled areas and a list of projects accomplished by the district.

- Air Conditioning Units installed in all classrooms and offices in the front of the school and on the North side of the school.
- New Cafeteria Tables have been purchased.
- New fence installed around the Green House.
- Removal of Blacktop next to the Greenhouse and grass seeding to provide additional play area for elementary students.
- Remodeling of the HS boys' and girls' locker rooms that have included new lockers, new restroom partitions, all new paint, and a new floor in the boys' locker room.
- The purchase and installation of new bleachers for the Multi-Purpose Facility.
- Remodeling of the HS Office.
- Painting, new lights, and refinished trophy cases for the HS Entry.
- Painting of areas that were not covered by the construction include restrooms, 25 classrooms, offices, Kitchen, Cafeteria, stairwells, doors and door frames.
- The installation of current and new White boards, new tables and chairs in needed areas.
- New signage inside and outside the building.
- Additional Flag Poles and new landscaping in front of the building.
- Tuck Pointing of the chimney
- Door replacement.
- Soffit replacement on the west, south, and east side of the building.
- Additional Mobile Chromebook Labs with touch screens in the Elementary classrooms and Chromebooks in other grade levels.
- New PTO playground.

# News from the Hill

The school year is here! We are starting to develop a routine within the JH/HS and the elementary school. Students seem to adjusting well to the new classrooms, hallways, locker areas, and lunch schedule. I am very pleased with their patience and attitudes.



### **Behavior Incentive Program**

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a proactive approach to establishing the behavioral supports and social culture and needed for all students in a school to achieve social, emotional and academic success. We have extended the PBIS RUFUS program to the elementary school. The RUFUS program rewards exemplary behavior at any time during the quarter. ALL students can earn RUFUS tickets from teachers when they go above and beyond the behavioral expectations. They will be entered into a drawing at the end of the quarter. Twelve students are drawn from K-5, and sixteen students 6-12. Those students will receive a prize at the quarterly award assembly. If a child K-5 receives a RUFUS, they will bring home a ticket stub indicating they earned one.

Orangeville School District will continue to offer behavior incentives to students who continuously meet the expectation. Our focus this quarter will be on respecting time and respecting others. Our goal is to reduce tardiness before and during school and to keep students attentive in classrooms. Starting on September 16<sup>th</sup> and running through October 25<sup>th</sup>, students at the junior high and high school may have no more than 1 tardy, and no more than 1 cell phone violation. Students at the elementary school must have no more than 1 tardy, AND no more than 1 office referral. They also must meet classroom behavior expectations. Students in grades K-2 will use the word HOCKEY (6 chances for behavior), and students in 3rd-5th will use the word GOAL (4 chances for behavior). The office will be keeping a record of tardies and office referrals. Teachers will take away a letter for inappropriate classroom behavior. If a student runs out of letters before Oct 25<sup>th</sup>, they will not be eligible for the reward.

Students meeting these expectations at their respective schools will be eligible to purchase a \$5 ticket to the **IceHogs professional ice hockey game at 10:30 am in Rockford, IL on Wednesday, November 6**th. Students will leave school at 8:50 am and return at 2:00 pm. Students can make the difference in the school community and building environment which Respects Yourself and Others, Respects Property, and Respects Time.

### **School Safety Drill**

Wednesday, September 25

At a TBD date in October, we will do an active shooter drill with students present. The new law states students must be present and has to be done within 90 calendar days of the beginning of the school year. You will get more information on this within a few weeks. Your child will learn how to react in case of a real safety threat. While everyone is aware that no one measure is entirely effective to prevent a school shooting, our hope is to improve our proactive plans to better prevent and prepare for an aggressive threat.
