C) Food Service year-end review - Gina Freel

Gina Freel, Child Nutrition Director gave an end of year review of the Food Service Program.

The program is doing well, operating in the black this year.

Changes made - program types from Provision 2 to Community Eligibility Program, evaluated food costs, joined a Treasure Valley bid group with approximately 28 others, reopened Mac Hall Cafeteria, opened the Bulldog Lounge for high school students, second year for Early Head Start Program, currently have a full run cycle menu so students receive home cooked meals more

often, send out food surveys to students to see what they like, two paid student helpers and two part time helpers.

Challenges -

- Most schools have one main cafeteria for the entire district, we have several sites
- Addition of Early Head Start Programs (two sites), another menu and food requirements to meet
- Food prepared in main kitchen and transported to satellite kitchens at Mac Hall and middle school.
- Keeping food warm, at temperature and palatable
- Equipment, steam pots variation of days, back to back, not enough room
- Time efficiency loading, unloading
- Staff rotation

The new middle school will be awesome. Set up one day, lock up and it will be ready the next with everything all in one place.

Mr. McRae, HS Principal expressed kudos to Gina and her crew for the hospitality shown to the accreditation team and for preparing lunches for noon detention upon receipt of a last minute phone call.

- D) Structure, Management Plan for Advisory Mr. McRae and MR. Cleaver Discussion -
 - Overly ambitious, one advisory per week
 - Once per month transcript review, schedule check on track for graduation, student guided review
 - Do work without a huge time commitment
 - Middle School Career Exploration, PBIS
 - Start Ed Plan Profile
 - five minutes out of each period, 36 minute advisory
 - Give kids adequate time
