

### Little Miners (3 yr olds)



These classes are full of developmentally appropriate activities just right for your 3 year old.

Child must be 3 years old by September 1 of the current school year and potty trained in order to attend.

The class offers learning opportunities that foster growth in the following areas: cognitive, communication, motor, self-help, and social-emotional development. Interested families should contact staff at the CRES Little Rangers Family Center for more information.

These classes provide children with opportunities to participate with other children in a school setting in order to prepare them for success in Kindergarten. Children must be 4 or 5 years old by September 1 of the current school year in order to attend.

Class activities include self directed learning centers, circle time, learning stations, art projects, music, finger plays, snack, small and large muscle time in the gym or outside, if weather permits.

Preschool classes are offered on a sliding fee scale based on household income and scholarships are available to those who qualify. Families who register and pay full year tuition by June 30, 2023 will receive a 10% discount on their tuition!

### Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE)

Early Childhood Special Education is a program that provides early intervention and preschool special education to young children, age birth to Kindergarten, who show developmental delays in the general areas of speech and language, large and fine motor skills, social and emotional behavior, cognitive and/or adaptive skills, or have vision or hearing loss. After a child receives a formal evaluation to identify specific needs, trained ECSE teachers and specialists will work with the caregivers and child to develop his/her greatest potential. From birth to age three, these Special Education services are delivered to the child primarily in his/her home or child care center. From age three to Kindergarten, children receive these services in the CRES Family Center.

Parents have the right to request an educational evaluation if they have concerns about or suspect delays in their child's development. It is provided through the school district educational services at no cost to the family.

The Ranger Ride, hosted by Crosby-Ironton Community Education (made possible by a Hallett Trust Grant) teaches youth ages 6 to 13 mountain biking skills. After two days of basic skill instruction, students can attend a weekly ride to practice those skills. This 8-week program is designed for beginners and intermediate youth riders. Participants can attend as many (or all!) of the sessions, as they are able. The volunteer ride leaders are passionate about getting kids on bikes, healthy living, and enjoying the outdoors and mountain bike trails of the Cuyuna Lakes Area.



### RANGER UPDATE

### Hello Crosby-Ironton Community!

At the Crosby-Ironton School District, our vision is, "Empowering Students for Lifelong Success." This vision provides staff with a common direction of what we want the future to look like for our students.

One of my favorite belief statements in the school district's strategic plan is, "We believe that all educational experiences should prepare students for life after high school." From the classroom lessons, to co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, our school district strives to prepare students for their future life beyond high school.

### Our story:

- 1. Student Achievement Above state average!
- 2. Community Ed Outreach, which also includes more opportunities for residents in Emily.
- 3. AFTT This parent engagement initiative is used by only two school districts in the entire state of Minnesota; Crosby-Ironton and St. Paul!
- 4. Facilities Modernization: Taxpayers approved a \$29.5 million dollar bond referendum in 2019. Each summer, the school district has been renovating its facilities to modernize learning spaces and to maximize the efficient use of existing spaces.
- 5. WIN CRES Team This group of highly trained educators has catapulted literacy instruction at CRES. Furthermore, the CRES WIN Team is the engine that drives the AFTT parent engagement program.
- 6. STEAM Lab CRES has a \$250,000 technology laboratory where students in grades kindergarten through sixth learn concepts about science, technology, engineering, art and math. In addition, the teacher, Ms. Larsen, has presented at international technology conferences.
- 7. Monthly reports on the WBWF Each month, teachers provide a progress monitoring report on a specific element of the World's Best Workforce goals.
- 8. Mentorship The C-I School District hired 19 new staff members at the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year. Our comprehensive teacher mentor program ensures that new teachers to the school district can be successful at helping our students experience success. A huge thank you to Mrs. Dietz and Mrs. Gindorff for managing a sterling teacher mentorship program!

**Budget:** The C-I School District has a one million dollar deficit right now. If the legislature approves funding for the special education Cross-Subsidy and, also, increases state aid by five percent, the school district will be much closer to balancing its budget. If the legislature does not provide a significant increase in funding to public schools in Minnesota, including C-I, other options to balance such a large deficit will need to be explored.

**Summer Construction:** The most significant change that parents will see when they return in the fall is a new and improved parent drop-off zone at CRES. A new exit road will be added at CRES to make leaving the parking lot much more efficient.

**Help wanted:** Our school district, along with many other businesses, as well as manufacturing companies, continues to experience a workforce shortage. We have a shortage of applicants for all vacancies that arise. We especially need help recruiting custodians and bus drivers. Looking for a job? Apply at the Crosby-Ironton School District today!
