The Governor of the great state of Michigan, has proclaimed January as School Board Recognition Month. This is a time to focus on the crucial role board members play in our communities and schools.

School board members come from all walks of life. While they wear many hats in the workday world, school board members put on a collective hat when they get down to the business of leading our school districts. Board members must pull together as a team toward a common goal – making decisions that benefit our students.

The time spent in board meetings represents just a small fraction of the time school board members devote to leading their districts. They also serve on various committees, sustain their own professional development through the Michigan Association of School Boards, and stay abreast of the political landscape that directly impacts our schools. In addition, our board members are deeply involved in school and community activities, and spend many hours in the schools and at extracurricular events. One of their most important responsibilities is to ensure the financial health of the district. Of course, some of the operating revenue comes from those who live and/or own businesses within the district boundaries and there are times that the Board must request support for millages or bond issues.

On the March 10, 2020 presidential primary election, the Swan Valley School District will have a proposal on the ballot. The proposal is for the renewal of the 18 mills used to support the Swan Valley Schools. The last renewal was approved in March of 2016 and expires at the end of 2020. This renewal will levy this millage for the next four years (through 2024). The non-homestead tax is levied on business and commercial property as well as rental homes and second homes. The 18 mills provides the Swan Valley School District with approximately \$1,754,083 which is nearly 10% of the total revenue received by the district. This ballot does not impact the residential property owner.

The ballot language/question will read as follows:

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance and renews millage that will expire with the 2020 tax levy.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Swan Valley School District, Saginaw County, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 4 years, 2021 to 2024, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2021 is approximately \$1,754,083 (this is a renewal of millage which will expire with the 2020 tax levy)?

Operating Millage Renewal Proposal on Non-Homestead Properties

What is the cost to the Homeowner?

COST TO THE HOMEOWNER IS \$0. This operating millage renewal will allow the district to levy 18 mills on non-homestead property. If approved, homeowners will not see an increase in their property taxes. In other words, this millage renewal will not change the taxes on your primary house in which you live. This is not a new tax. It is a proposal to continue the existing 18 mill assessment on non-homestead properties.

Who pays the operating millage?

The operating millage is levied on properties that do not qualify for the homestead exemption. This represents industrial, commercial, and some agricultural properties and second homes. Primary residences qualify for the homestead exemption and, therefore, do not pay this 18 mill tax.

I thought schools no longer received funding through property taxes, so why is there a millage renewal?

Funding for school districts changed significantly in 1993/1994 when Proposal A was passed by the Michigan voters. Under Proposal A, the State pays the majority of the cost, but to receive full funding, schools must levy 18 mills locally on non-homestead property in their district.

Is this a new tax?

No. This millage has been in place since 1994. The District was given voter approval to levy 18 mills on non-homestead property in June 1994. The current millage expires with the 2020 tax levy. The District is requesting a 4-year renewal.

Will my residential school taxes increase too?

No. This tax is on non-homestead property and does not apply to your primary place of residence.

What happens if the millage doesn't pass?

The revenue generated from the 18 mills on non-homestead property totals approximately \$1.7 million, or 10%. Failure to renew the operating millage would significantly decrease the operating funds of our school district. The State will not replace the lost funding and the District will be forced to reduce or eliminate instructional and support programs for our students to offset the reduction of revenue.

2018-19 Audit Report

On September 26th, the Swan Valley Board of Education approved the 2018-19 audit of the district by Gardner, Provenzano, Thomas, and Luplow, P.C. The 2018-19 school year ended with a general fund surplus of \$202,950 increasing the fund balance to \$2,385,340 or 13.8 % of general fund expenditures. It was recommended the fund balance be approximately 10% - 15% of general fund expenditures. A copy of the audit report is available on the district's website.

Swan Valley Adult and Alternative Education provides a blended and online learning opportunity. All students work independently by using online curriculum and classes are self-paced per semester. Classes are Monday through Thursday from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm and on Friday from 9:00 am until 12:30 pm. Students are expected to complete two virtual courses as part of their school day. Alternative students are age 16-22 and Adult students are 22 and older. Free and reduced lunch is available in our evening program. All teachers are highly qualified in each of the core curriculum. Any student wishing to apply to this program needs to contact Ms. Hanson and have on hand a copy of his/her transcript, discipline and attendance records, along with a copy of their birth certificate and two pieces of residency are required. Please call the number listed above to make an appointment.

Credit Recovery for Swan Valley High School students is also available through the Alternative program. Students who are deficit in graduation requirement credits need to make an appointment with the principal or assistant principal to create a credit recovery plan. These students are required to attend on Tuesday and Thursday from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. The cost of classes are \$100.00 for credit recovery and free/reduced lunch student cost is \$50.00.



Swan Valley Learning Center



Swan Valley Learning Center is a fully licensed year-round program that provides before and after school care, as well as a full and part-time preschool program.

Our preschool program focuses on pre-skills, which lay the groundwork for the future. Through their playing, singing and learning, preschoolers gain skills that ultimately help them learn to read, write, build math, science skills, and become successful students. Preschoolers also learn "school readiness" skills, which help them understand the routines of school, how to work in groups, and how to be students. Preschool classrooms are organized by centers or areas that are divided by different developmental areas and types of play. Centers available include: reading, arts, crafts, water/sand table, building, math toys, fine motor skills toys, large motor skills toys, and an area for pretend play. The preschool day is structured with both academic and free play time, during which children can choose which centers to play in, as well as a structured scheduled time devoted to academics.

> During our before school program, we provide a nutritional balanced breakfast daily, with a variety of hot and cold choices to ensure they start their day out right. After school we allow time for our children to work on their homework. Our Program has iPads and computers available for the

children to use to further their learning through educational apps and websites. The children also have time to be with their friends.

Any child who meets the age requirement (3-12) and is enrolled in the Swan Valley District may attend. We also accept non-resident students. Transportation is provided to and from Havens Elementary and Shields Elementary during the school year. Hours of operation are 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Our certified and enthusiastic team is dedicated to providing the best care for your child. With licensed teachers on staff at all times, we are sure to enhance your child's experience while they are away from home.










ELECTION DF 1796

ran after school with their coaches. The sessions ended with a culminating 1 mile run at the high school track!



A student cannot participate in a schoolsponsored or operated athletic activity until the student and a parent each have received the concussion fact sheet for students and the concussion fact sheet for parents, respectively. Both the student and parent must sign and return a form acknowledging receipt of the fact sheet or other concussion awareness educational material. The concussion awareness forms are in addition to the yearly sport physical required on or after the April 15th date of the previous school year.
