



Childhood Vaccinations

Oklahoma law provides as follows:

No minor child shall be admitted to any public, private, or parochial school operating in this state unless and until certification is presented to the appropriate school authorities from a licensed physician, or authorized representative of the State Department of Health, that such child has received or is in the process of receiving, immunizations against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, haemophilus influenzae type B (HIB), measles (rubeola), (rubella), poliomyelitis, varicella, and hepatitis A or is likely to be immune as a result of the disease. [70 O.S. § 1210.191.](#)

Pursuant to the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, arriving military children shall be given thirty (30) days after enrollment to obtain any required immunizations.

Parents do have the right in Oklahoma to object to the immunization of their child as per [70 O.S. § 1210.192.](#)

Parents wishing to object to the immunization of their child(ren) must utilize the form prepared by the Oklahoma State Department of Health. Schools can obtain this form from the Department of Health at 1 (800) 234-6196 or (405) 271-4073 for completion by parents.
