
## **Academics**

## **May Guidance & Counseling Report:**

**Link Crew:** Recruitment for 2017-18 Link Crew program will begin soon. Greta Thompson is attending Link Crew training in San Diego and will help lead Link Crew in the 2017-18 school year.

**PLUS:** The grant we received from the Slager Foundation provides funds for staff/admin training later this month. Kathleen feels that the program provides structure at the administrative level to help impact our school climate.

**YEP:** Youth Educator Program: There are 22 students working with Karen Kong(ICSOS), to visit HSMS and discuss with the 8<sup>th</sup> graders how to transition smoothly to high school. These will take place in late May **Testing:** 

**CAASPP Testing:** 11<sup>th</sup> grade SBAC testing is planned for May 16, 16, 23, 24. 10<sup>th</sup> grade will be taking the Pilot CAST: California Science Test this year is a computer based test will be May 18.

**AP Exams**: May 1- 10<sup>th</sup>. We have 75 students taking 154 AP Exams. 19 students have used fee waivers to take 34 of the exams. This is the same number of students as in 2016, but about 15 less tests taken, whereas in 2015 was: 68 students taking 168.

**SAT**: May 6<sup>th</sup> and June 3<sup>th</sup> remain.

**UC-AWPE:** The UC system's Analytical Writing Placement Exam is scheduled for May 13. This exam is required for students admitted to the UC with questionable SAT/ACT writing scores.

## **Grade Reporting:**

.4th quarter progress reports will be issued by May 12<sup>th</sup>.

Summer school enrollment letters were mailed to 78 students to repeat courses for credit (English, Math, Social Studies, health), while 51 notices were sent to students who need to improve a D grade (in English or Social Studies) to maintain "a-g" eligibility.

**Senior activities**: the first senior activity is scheduled for May 12<sup>th</sup> selecting seating for graduation. Only seniors passing all classes required for graduation, with a 65% and who have completed their community service will be allowed to participate. The next senior activity will be Senior Pic Nic and we will again expect 65% in classes and community service to be completed for students to go to the picnic.

**Scholarship Season:** The entire senior class was provided a Community Scholarship application and given 3 weeks to complete, only 61 of 133 students submitted the application which was a better response than last year. Links to all federal and state financial aid websites are operational from the Guidance / Financial Aid web page. The Guidance / Scholarships page is active. Scholarships are also being announced in the daily bulletin, with reminders being made in Senior Home Rooms. Hard copies are always available in the Guidance Office. **Master Schedule:** In progress.

Some spring sports are wrapping up league competition. Track has completed league and so far we have two qualifiers for CIF. To qualify for CIF, you must have a fully automated time. Our top 15 track athletes are trying for a qualifying time one last time at the All Sierra Invitational May 3<sup>rd</sup>. Swim wraps up their league finals on May 3, but unfortunately there have been no CIF qualifying times this year. Golf is on track to be the league champions and team CIF is Monday May 8<sup>th</sup>. Currently the baseball team is in a three way tie for 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the league and they are ranked #9 in the division. Play offs begin on Wednesday May 17<sup>th</sup>. Currently the softball team is tied for 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the league and they are ranked #6 in the division. Play offs begin Tuesday May 16<sup>th</sup>. Both baseball and softball teams are on track to meet the minimum requirements to put in for play offs, but the final decision will probably come down to a few upcoming key games.
