# Our Path Note Topic

As WASD learns more about customizing and personalizing education, we learn about those barriers that can prevent us from customizing education for students. These barriers are sometimes referred to as Weight Bearing Walls.

Some examples of Weight Bearing Walls (WBW) are Grade Levels, Students Assigned to a Specific Classroom, Class Period/Bell Schedule, Courses/Curriculum, Textbooks, Paper/Pencil, ABC Grading System, Report Cards, Learning Happens in School, and Nine Month School Year. The Access4All technology program in which each student has a computer can sometimes remove a WBW. If you look at those mentioned above, the one-to-one program can remove paper/pencil and learning just in school. If you examine it more, you can remove more WBWs with the Access4All/One-to-One program. Courses are taught typically in school by a face-to-face class with a teacher during a specific time and day throughout the school year. The personal laptop provided to students can change all of that. Therefore, some WBWs have been removed to provide a more personalized/customized education for students.

WBWs are another change in the way we think about teaching and education. During the upcoming Inservice day, you will learn more about WBWs and other ways of thinking about education, teaching, and learning. Our purpose is to personalize and customize education for each student. "When you customize learning, the fast runners run really, really fast; and the slow runners run faster than you ever thought they would" (MCL Presentation).
