# Principal's Message

# 2020 WinterKids Student / Parent Winter Outdoor Afternoon

All students have received invitational letters to be brought home related to next Wednesday's (January 22nd) WinterKids Student / Parent Winter Outdoor Afternoon to be held here at school and at the Hidden Valley Nature Center in Jefferson. Please read over the invitation and, hopefully, find a way to participate in some or all of the program. Our PreK to Grade 2 students will be participating in a variety of activities here at WHES while our students in grades 3-8 will be bussed to HVNC at 1:00 p.m. with our program concluding at 4:20 p.m. with a final clean up and walk out to the parking lot. The Pre K-2 program at WHES will conclude at 4:00 p.m., at which point students using our transportation will board busses to HVNC to pick up the older students and then returned home. This WinterKids programming is the major activity of our Parent Engagement Week of WinterKids and the plans call for a great deal of fun outdoor winter activities. The agenda holds time for students / parents to participate in activities such as: snow shoeing, sledding, snow art, shelter building, cross country skiing, sledding and fat tire biking. Snacks will also be provided during the afternoon. Unless parents make other plans, transportation home will be on the students' regular WHES bus, beginning at approximately 4:30 p.m. Parents can communicate their transportation plans on the invitation form and those parents who will have their child(ren) use school transportation will need to plan accordingly for their child's return home at a unique time and with very low light.

The long range weather forecast plays right into the WinterKids theme with predictions for some accumulating snow reaching our area both on Sunday. With that said, the long range forecast points the temperature for January 22nd having a high of 20 degrees. This would indicate that all participants in our program will need to be dressed for those conditions. HVNC does have some warming huts and our Pre K-2 students will have the school available. Students in grades 3-8 will be scheduled into the HVNC warming huts during the afternoon but please make sure your child(ren), as well as yourself, come appropriately dressed for a Maine winter afternoon.

I want to personally thank Andy Bezon and the Midcoast Conservancy for being such great partners in the planning and operating of this very special program. Our 4th grade class participates in HVNC's Outdoor Education Program each year and Midcoast Conservancy provides Americorps volunteers to WHES to run our Outdoor PE Program that includes fat tire biking, cross country skiing and orienteering. Midcoast is also partnering with the school and Town of Whitefield in applying for grants to, hopefully, build a four season trail that would utilize both town and school property with the benefits to both school children and citizens being significant.

Office: Please remember to send your child to school with a note if they are going to a different destination on the bus after school. It helps to avoid last minute phone calls to the school, which can make dismissal very chaotic. We appreciate the advance notice and thank you for not calling with these changes after 2:00 p.m.
