

Preschool News


Numbers, nuts, nests, and New Year-This week we have been learning about the letter Nn!

Next week we will be learning about the letter O- maybe we will find our friend, Olaf, learn about owls, and all the creatures in the ocean!







Is it reading or is it math...

Here are lists of math vocabulary words by grade level that will help your child in both reading and math!

First Grade Math Vocabulary Terms

- Algebraic Thinking alike, similar, object, match, size
- Base Ten Operations horizontal, vertical, whole number, compare, solve, value, digit
- Measurement & Data month, chart, measure, thermometer, likely, pint, quart
- Geometry size, intersect, corner, curves, location, in front of, line of symmetry, sphere

Try to use some of these words in conversation at home.

Examples:

- -Let's measure if your book will fit on the shelf.
- -Use the line of symmetry to fold your clothes.
