Band Room Guidelines

1. Food, drinks, gum, candy, etc are NOT permitted in band room.
2. Only percussionists and directors may touch percussion equipment.
3. Only directors may touch the sound and recording equipment.
4. Only band students are allowed in the band room.
5. Students should use and touch only their own instrument.
6. Instrument cubbies must be kept clean and will contain only your instrument and music.
7. Instruments must be taken home at the end of each school day. (Exceptions for large or shared instruments)
8. Negativity, fighting, running, bad language will not be tolerated.
9. Respect others at all times.
10. Follow school rules in the band room and on all band activity trips.

Rehearsal Guidelines

1. When entering the room, students should prepare themselves and their instruments and music for rehearsal. This is NOT a time for socializing. Check the board each day for instructions and goals for that class period.
2. Class begins at the designated time. Students who are not in their correct place, with their instruments ready to play will be counted as late.
3. The class will be dismissed by the teacher. Classes that begin on time and are efficient during rehearsal will have plenty of time to stow away their equipment before the bell rings.
4. Be prepared to participate in class fully every day. Bring your instrument, music, pencil, and necessary equipment to class every day.

If you choose to disregard any of these guidelines, you may face consequences arranged by the directors or principals.

Extra Credit

Extra credit may occasionally be offered for students to broaden their musical experience and knowledge. Opportunities will be posted when occasions arise. It is the opinion of the directors that if students simply do what they are suppose to when they are suppose to then they won't need extra credit.

Eligibility

1. Become familiar with Noble Public Schools and the OSSAA rules for eligibility. You may not participate in band activities if your are ineligible.
2. Keep up with and turn in all your homework in all your classes!!! Having zeros for homework assignments is a very common reason for students to be failing a class.
3. Band is about teamwork, and we need all our team members to perform with us to be highly successful. Frequent ineligibility reports will result in a conference with directors and parents regarding further participation in band.

Concert Attire

All middle school band students should wear the following for concert performances:

- Boys: Button up dress shirt (and a tie would be preferred), dress slacks, nice clean socks and shoes.
- Girls: Nice dress shirt and skirt or slacks or a dress if you prefer.

The bottom line is we want the students to be clean and neat in appearance. Dress as professional as possible.

All high school band students will typically wear band uniforms for performances. You will be required to provide clean all black shiny patent shoes and all black full length socks. High school students should also prepare for other optional dress standards. Please check the band web site www.noblebands.com for details.

Fundraising

There will be numerous band fundraising opportunities throughout the year. These fundraisers are vital to the band's success, as we purchase supplies, instruments, and music with the monies raised. On some occasions, individual student earnings may go directly towards their participation in designated band activities.

Attendance

Band is a TEAM effort. Unlike many athletics though, we do not have a second string or substitute bench we can use at a moments notice. We plan and prepare for our band to perform and sound their best with the total given instrumentation. Any absence from rehearsal effects preparation efforts, which in turn compromises performance quality. Any absence from performance unfairly effects' the entire band. That being said the following attendance policy will be the accepted practice.

- Rehearsal absence (regular or extra) should be reported as far in advance as possible by calling the band office 872-7620 or email fqueen@nobleps.com color guard may also call color guard instructor directly.
- Performance absence must be cleared in advance of performance by parent/guardian in writing or via email to director of bands. Reason for requested absence must be detailed to be considered. ("We have other or previous plans" is not acceptable.)
- Director of bands will review and approve all absence.
- "Excused" rehearsal absence may possibly require extra make up time depending on the circumstances.
- "Excused" performance absence may possibly require make up time depending on the circumstances.
- "Unexcused" rehearsal absence will be credited against student grade.
- Each "Unexcused" performance will lower student overall grade 10%.
- Any absence not pre-approved will be considered unexcused until properly documented to the director.
- Tardiness is unacceptable and will be credited against students' daily participation grade. School policies regarding tardiness will also be enforced which may include lunch time detention and Saturday school.
- Regular and continued absence and/or tardiness may result in temporary or permanent suspension from band performances and will have a major impact on students' grade.

We realize there are emergencies to deal with and there will be scheduling conflicts arise with other school and/or community events and activities. We simply ask that you keep a personal schedule planner and inform us immediately when conflicts arise so we might work them out in your best interests and in fairness to everyone involved. We have some of the busiest students in school in our band program. The successful ones are organized and balance their life well. The others' usually have to accept the consequences.

Simply put, if you're not there we can't teach you. If you don't learn your part, you don't contribute to the group and, this is simply not fair to the group.

Honor Bands and Solo/Ensemble Participation

- Extra activities such as honor bands and solo/ensemble contest are highly encouraged for all students
- Your grade will not be effected by these events but if you enter you will be expected to follow through and participate to the best of your ability.
- There are small entry fees involved for many of these extra events which will be the student's responsibility. Amounts and deadlines will be announced as they approach.

Financial Responsibilities

1. All band students may need to purchase a band shirt to wear for different occasions throughout the year. Information regarding shirts will be sent home during the first few weeks of school. Depending on the style and quality of the shirt, the price will range from \$0 - \$20.
2. Some school instruments are available for rent from the school. Students renting these instruments will be provided a form to be signed by their parent or guardian before the instrument is issued. Each student will be responsible for damage to the instrument while they have it checked out.
3. Percussion students will be required to provide their own personal stick/mallet bag. A list of required percussion supplies for each grade level will be issued at the start of school.
4. Students who do not rent from the school must provide their own instrument and keep it in good playing condition. Affordable rental / purchase plans are available at area music stores.
5. Besides an instrument, students should also need to purchase:
 - the prescribed method book for their class level.
 - a music stand for proper at home practice
 - necessary accessories to maintain and care for your instrument
6. Students must be responsible for music issued to them.
7. Extra trips or activities may have some cost involved.

*We want all of our students to have the opportunity to participate in band. If your family has any financial situations which are keeping your child from obtaining and maintaining supplies for band, please let us know. We will do all we can to help you. We do not want a financial issue to prevent a student from participating in band.
