Effective Compacts:

- » Focus on student learning skills
- » Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- » Share specific strategies parents can use at home
- » Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- » Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

Communication about Student Learning and Behavior

CCEC is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

In the 1st Grade Classroom and at Home

The 1ST grade classroom will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- There will be spelling word activities sent home weekly.
- Our weekly classroom newsletter will feature websites and other activities for families to play and review often.
- Teachers will periodically post pictures on Class Dojo from an activity in class to be used as talking points for parents at home. Parents can ask students to explain what was happening in the picture.
- Students will start off the school year learning Sight Words and transition into Sight Word Phrases. Spelling words will be tested every Friday.

CCEC 1ST Grade students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

1. Read chapter books at home
2. Practice math at home
3. Read at home with an adult
4. Ask for practice work for math
5. Study spelling words
6. Study sight words
7. Use fingers to help me count
8. Do activities sent home to help me study at home
9. Do homework

At CCEC parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.
