From Associate Principal, Caleb Houchins & Chris Flake, SRO-

During the Teacher In-Service on Monday, January 6, SRO Chris Flake and other members of the Highland Police Department, Grantfork Police Department, Madison County Sheriff's Department, and Highland EMT held a *Stop the Bleed* safety training for all High School and Middle School faculty. Teachers rotated through several stations that showed how to use a basic tourniquet and an Israeli Bandage, make slings, and transfer victims out of unsafe areas. This in-service was done in conjunction with the new school safety buckets that have been provided to every teacher in the district. Every teacher now has the resources and knowledge to provide first aid in any emergency situation.

On Thursday, January 9th, *Whim 'N Rhythm*, an all female a capella group from Yale University, performed a concert for the entire student



body at Highland High School. The concert ranged from present day Top 40 hits like *Rumor Has It* by Adele to classic country songs such as *Jolene* by Dolly Parton. It was an excellent concert and our student body enjoyed the show. Exposure to the arts is a key component in giving all of our students a well rounded education. Stay tuned for additional PLC assemblies that are in the works for February and March.

From the School Counselors-Mary Jackson (Department Chair). Carrie Lieberman, and Amber Spaeth: December was busy wrapping up groups for the semester and helping students prepare for final exams. Counselors attended the ISCA Workshop, Helping Students with Trauma and Emotional Dysregulation and the SWIC Partnership Day. Approximately 106 students signed-in for individual appointments. Roughly 48% were seniors; 12% juniors; 17% sophomores and 23% freshman. Students signed in 70% of the time for Academic Reasons; 21% for College or Career Reasons, and 9% of the time for Personal (Social/ Emotional) Reasons. <u>From Natalie Propst, School Nurse-</u> Just a friendly reminder that we are in the midst of flu season. Per the CDC, there are several steps you can take to protect your student and household from the flu, which include the following:



- Get the flu vaccination as it's recommended for those 6 months and older.
- Stay away from those who are sick.
- Keep those who are sick with flu-like illnesses away from others, and keep those with illness home until fever free for 24 hours, without the use of medication.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing.
- Wash hands often with soap and water, or alcohol based hand rub if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching face (eyes, nose, and mouth).
- Clean and disinfect surfaces that may be contaminated with germs with household disinfectants, according to label directions.

SAT SUITE OF ASSESSMENTS

Participation in College Planning Options Consent Form

Your child will participate in one of the SAT* Suite of Assessments on a school day—SAT*, PSAT/NMSQT* or the PSAT™ 10. The purpose of this form is to explain the information your student will be required to provide and the options available to your student related to their free SAT score sends, Student Search Service*, and the student questionnaire.

REQUIRED INFORMATION

Students will be required to provide College Board, the provider of the SAT Suite of Assessments, their first and last name, school name and school code, date of birth, grade level, gender and, for some states and districts, student identification number. This information is the minimum needed for scoring and reporting test results.

Options for Students

FREE SCORE SENDS

Students who are taking the SAT can send their scores to up to four colleges or scholarship programs at no cost. Score sends are optional, but we encourage students to demonstrate their interest in their chosen schools early. If left blank, no scores will be sent. Consent is not required for students to utilize their four free score sends.

STUDENT SEARCH SERVICE

As a parent, you can give consent for your student to opt in to Student Search Service when they complete their answer sheet. Student Search Service connects students with colleges and scholarship organizations by sharing their information with participating organizations. This offers you and your student:

- Information about colleges and universities that match your student's academic interests
- Information on financial aid and scholarships to help deserving students access scholarships they've earned
- Information about majors, courses, and degree options

College Board only shares student data with eligible colleges, universities, scholarships, and educational opportunity programs that have signed an agreement to only communicate with students for the purposes listed above. These entities most often connect with students based on expected graduation date, cumulative grade point average (GPA), score range, and intended college major.

STUDENT QUESTIONNAIRE

As a parent, you can give consent for your student to participate in the student questionnaire. The information from these questions will be added to their College Board student record. Your child's responses to the optional questionnaire:

- Provide data used by College Board for research and planning to improve tests and services
- Help match students with colleges, universities, scholarships, and educational opportunity programs

The Student Guide describes what the questionnaire asks and how student information is used. Please review the Student Guide and indicate below if your child will or will not complete the optional questionnaire and opt in to Student Search Service.





After the medal round in Mascoutah, Ben Mitchell took 8th as Tanner Schranz and Alex Reed took 4th for Highland. Well done fellas!






